



will tell you I love the Chicago Blackhawks.




GIFTS

Editorial: Whether or not prenatal tests are wrong, expectant parents need our support

On Jan. 1, The New York Times published on its website a stunning article titled "When They Warn of Rare Disorders, These Prenatal Tests Are Usually Wrong." The piece, written by Sarah Kliff, an investigative reporter who focuses on health care for the Times, and freelance writer and researcher Aatish Bhatia, explores the inaccuracy of tests that screen the unborn for a variety of rare diseases and genetic conditions.

In a New Year's Day tweet, Kliff sums up the article: "Prenatal tests promise to detect rare genetic diseases in babies by scanning DNA. Labs market them as 'reliable.' They tell women to have 'total confidence' in results. It turns out, the grave predictions made by those tests are usually wrong. What we found: The tests' findings of disorders are wrong a surprising amount of the time, between 81 and 93 percent."

Thousands of people have commented on the article on The New York Times' website and Facebook page, many of whom share heartwrenching stories – mothers and fathers who contemplated aborting their child after receiving the news that he or she might be born with a lifethreatening or life-altering health condition, only to give birth to a fully healthy child. While undergoing prenatal testing is not in and of itself immoral, any conclusion leading to abortion most certainly is.

What gets lost in conversations about diagnoses of prenatal defects and the abortions to which they too often lead is that, regardless of their physical health, children born with Down syndrome or any other genetic abnormality are no less human than anyone else. On World Down Syndrome Day on March 21, 2021, Pope Francis tweeted: "Every child who a woman expects in her womb is a gift that changes a family's history: the life of fathers and mothers, grandparents and of brothers and sisters. That child needs to be welcomed, loved and nurtured. Always!"

COVID Guidelines from the Archdiocese by Deacon Allen

Last week, Archbishop Listecki emailed a communications to all parish leaders outlining guidelines and considerations as we continue to learn to live with COVID-19 in our midst and adjust to the changing variants. I want to let you know that St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish will continue using the protocols already in place to help us feel safe while attending Mass. The protocols include offering hand sanitizer and extra cleaning between Masses. If you feel more comfortable wearing a mask, please do so, but we will not make it mandatory. If you do not wish to mask, we ask that you respect the preferences of others and their possible desire to socially distance.

We are sensitive to concerns about religious education, and other scheduled large parish meetings. We have been told by the Archdiocese that where social distancing options are not available, we should consider postponing the meetings or changing them to virtual attendance. We did that just this past week when we decided against holding our monthly parish team meetings, and next weekend when we had scheduled Friendship Weekend at North Lake, which was canceled.

While there has been no outbreak of COVID-19 from Mass attendance, we have been asked to encourage you to exercise personal responsibility. Those who feel sick, or who are especially at risk of health complications, should stay home and watch Sunday worship livestreamed from our North Lake church, accessible from our parish website.

If you are ill, taking care of someone who is sick, or is at risk of serious illness due to exposure, your Sunday Mass attendance is excused.

The Archbishop added that our Sunday worship is a joyful obligation. It is a witness to God as the priority in our lives. By remaining diligent in these ways, we hope to ensure that you may continue experiencing the connectedness of our parish communities, which is such a vital part of our lives.

I cannot do all the GOOD the world needs, BUT the world needs all the GOOD I can do.

The parishioners and neighbors of St. Teresa Parish certainly took these wise words to heart during this past Christmas season. We thank all of you who donated so generously to our Giving Trees, our Christmas Meal Drive, and our Food Pantry requests. You really helped spread the Christmas Joy to families who might otherwise have had very little.

Thank you also to Denise Wiskow's 8th grade Religious Education class who helped organize food for our Christmas food basket distribution. What great helpers! We certainly look forward to partnering with them and other industrious students on future projects.

The world around us does, in fact, have many needs right now. By working together, WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE!




