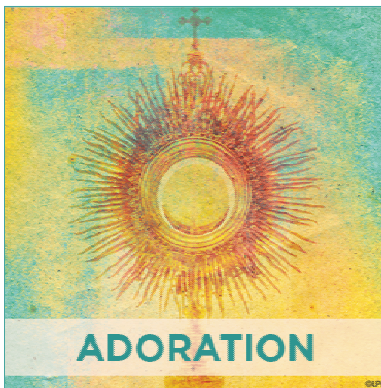

At this time I like to thank you for your special protection and prayer for me. Thank you for understanding my vision of missionary and priestly life and supporting me. I like to honor you with my prayers and special remembrance at the holy Mass.

As you are aware, the pandemic and the recent

floods here have severely affected many families. The sufferings and needs of the people are troubling us and we would like to reach out to them but our hands are tied because of our poor financial situation due to the prolonged lockdowns. The recent floods and landslides have destroyed many properties, washed away houses, and resulted in the loss of hundreds of lives. I would like to help at least five most deserving families re-build their houses. I also want to help some school children who are finding it difficult to make it to the school because of lack of funds to pay their school fees. We have a plan to introduce livelihood programs for the benefit of women and children in our mission villages. People of the area are mainly dependent on agriculture and the flood and landslides have devastated them.

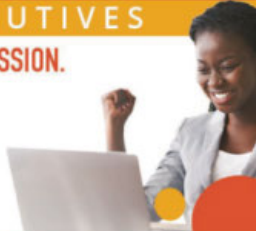
