

PRAYER & ADORATION

ST. JUSTIN MARTYR: AN APOLOGY DEFENDING THE REAL PRESENCE By Kathy Kordsmeier

Today, we learn about another early Church Father, St. Justin Martyr, a former pagan and convert to Christianity. From our source, *Behold, It is I: Scripture, Tradition, and Science on the Real* Presence, we come to understand that Justin used what is known as an apology (whence comes apologetics) to defend the early Christians against wrongful allegations concerning the Eucharist. There are four key conclusions contained in two chapters of Justin's First Apology which we will examine.

The first conclusion found in Chapter 65 begins with an account of the Lord's Supper, the early form of the Mass, which describes a liturgy corresponding to what we celebrate today. These parallels confirm the continuity of Catholic teaching and practice from the second century up to the 24th century. In Justin's time as in our time, there was the Sign of Peace, followed by the Presentation and Preparation of the Gifts, the Eucharistic Prayer, the Great Amen, the Communion Rite, and Communion to the Sick.

In Chapter 66 of the *First Apology* Justin illustrates the second significant point defending the Real Presence in the very first sentence. Here, he confirms that the second century Church taught what we still teach today concerning the guidelines for receiving Communion. He says: "...of which no one is allowed to partake but the man who believes that the things which we teach are true, and who has been washed with the washing that is for the remission of sins...." Thirdly, Justin declares that the Eucharist is the flesh and blood of Christ when he writes: "..., so likewise have we been taught that the food which is blessed by the prayer of His word....is the flesh and blood of that Jesus who was made flesh."

Finally, we read the fourth key conclusion when Justin alludes to the Gospels as memoirs: "... the apostles... have thus delivered unto us what was enjoined upon them; that Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, said, This do in remembrance of Me, this is My body....This is My blood..."

Next week St. Iranaeus of Lyons makes his appearance as a Father of the Church who firmly maintained the truth of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Lent Regulations 2023

FASTING is to be observed on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 22, 2023) and Good Friday (April 7, 2023) by all Catholics over 18 years of age to the beginning of their 60th year. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together should not equal another full meal, unless dispensed or excused.

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age or older. Ash Wednesday, all of the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice selfcontrol through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Regulaciones para la Cuaresama 2023

El AYUNO debe ser observado el Miércoles de Ceniza (22 de febrero de 2023) y el Viernes Santo (7 de abril de 2023) por todos los católicos mayores de 18 años hasta el comienzo de los 60 años. En los días de ayuno, se permite una comida completa. Se pueden tomar dos comidas más pequeñas, suficientes para mantener la fuerza, de acuerdo con las necesidades de cada uno, pero juntas no deben equivaler a otra comida completa, a menos que se prescinda o se justifique. La ABSTINENCIA de carne debe ser observada por todos los católicos mayores de 14 años. El Miércoles de Ceniza, todos los Viernes de Cuaresma y el Viernes Santo son días de abstinencia.

Durante la Cuaresma, buscamos al Señor en la oración leyendo la Sagrada Escritura; servimos dando limosna; y practicamos el dominio propio a través del ayuno. Estamos llamados no solo a abstenernos de los lujos durante la Cuaresma, sino a una verdadera conversión interior del corazón mientras buscamos seguir la voluntad de Cristo más fielmente. Recordamos las aguas del bautismo en las que también fuimos bautizados en la muerte de Cristo, morimos al pecado y al mal, y comenzamos una nueva vida en Cristo.
