CHRISTMAS: The Solemnity of Epiphany of the Lord - 2 JANUARY 2022

THERE'S REALLY NO RITUAL for what we do this weekend, and yet it's an occasion that warrants ritual — acknowledging and commemorating a significant moment in the life of our parish.

As a human community the Church that gathers each Lord's Day is never really the same from week to week. Each of us changes in some way during these intervening days; most impercepti-



bly and some more than others. Who gathers, how and where varies.

The church building in which the Church gathers, however, is more stable. Pews and chairs; altar, ambo and font; doors and lights — those material things don't usually change. But, now they will.

When we return to our church in the spring, or maybe early summer, where we gather will have been transformed, rather dramatically. All those things mentioned earlier will be larger, brighter, newer. No one will be sitting in the same spot — where, it seems at least, they've always sat.

As a people of faith we are, like the magi, always moving toward something new, taking a different way of sorts, but we are also deeply aware of our past, of where we've been; conscious of how that

MASS MOVING TO MCKILLIP HALL: Renovation of the church begins Tuesday and so Lord's Day Mass moves to McKillip Hall beginning next weekend, Jan. 8/9.

Here are a few reminders:

⇒ Enter through the main/west entrance. The south entrance is closed during construction.

⇒ Please honor all handicapped parking notices, and, if you are able, park further away to leave spaces closer to the building for those who need them most. (Many people already do this.)

⇒ Seats immediately inside the McKillip Hall doors will be reserved for people who have difficulty standing or walking and want communion brought to them.

Complete information regarding worship in our temporary chapel can be found in a newsletter mailed to all parishioners earlier this month. Further information about this move and the church renovation, is addressed in Quick Things email updates and at stanneswau-sau.org/re-imagining.

HELP REMOVING PEWS: The existing pews need to be removed to make way for construction equipment and, eventually, new pews. A crew of parishioners is needed on Monday, Jan. 3 at 9 a.m. to remove the pews. It's estimated to take about three hours, but the more workers who volunteer, the less time it will take and the lighter the load. Helpful tools include a straight screwdriver, 7/16 open-end wrench and hammer.

SPEAKING OF PEWS: If you would like one or two or all of the pews, they are yours for the taking. Contact the parish office first thing Monday morning or stop in as the pews are being removed, and they will be yours for the taking.

has formed us, guided and encouraged us. That's why we need to acknowledge and, hopefully, somehow ritualize our departure from *this* church in which we have worshiped for the past 35 years.

It's within this setting that new life has been sanctified and loved ones entrusted to the Lord; where marriage promises were shared, families gathered for Christmas, light conquered the darkness of Easter nights; where confident disciples gathered, again and again, and then returned to the world for greater love and service.

It was also where the parish celebrated the Funeral Mass of its beloved pastor, Fr. Bob McKillip, in 1984. The church we've known and appreciated was his inspiration. He wanted to encourage an awareness of community — the presence of Christ in those who gather. He enlisted a friend, an artist, to create our distinctive altar, ambo and chair.

It has all served the parish well. But, times change, liturgical and sacramental priorities and understandings evolve, time and use take their toll. A dramatic baptismal font, gathering space and entranceway are added. In time there's an awareness that somehow these various elements need to be brought into a better, more cohesive order. One thing, as it were, leading to another.

So, before we begin our months of worship in the hall dedicated to Fr. McKillip's legacy, we honor all that has transpired these past several decades, the occasions of grace and gratitude, of elation and grief, of delight and regret. We briefly take leave of our church, as was done when the original 1951 church was renovated, while also celebrating a hopeful trust Fr. McKillip often expressed. We praise the God who "is making all things new" — the Church that gathers and the church in which it gathers. **TL**
