Fr. Eric Mashak hasn't actually dropped from the sky, but we do suddenly have a priest coming to Wausau later





KNEELING & STANDING: Please remember that people at pews with kneelers, if able, are asked to kneel after the Holy, Holy and to stand at the Great Amen. People at chairs without kneelers, if able, are asked to remain standing - out of reverence - throughout the Eucharistic Prayer.

WE BOW TO THE ALTAR: The altar is the primary focal point as we gather to worship. Arriving or departing, we show reverence to the altar by bowing toward it before entering and leaving the pew. People standing at chairs without kneelers during the eucharistic prayer are encouraged to bow after the priest presents the bread and wine that have become the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ. We bow as the priest genuflects.


VISITING **TOGETHER:**

ate pastor of Resurrection and St. Michael parishes.

How this suddenly transpired is a bit of a mystery and it doesn't change the number of priests ministering in Wausau. Fr. Mashak, who has been associate pastor at St. Bronislava Parish in Plover since his ordination a year ago, is kind of swapping places with Fr. Juan Pedro Roblez-Baltazar who has been associate pastor of St. Matthew Parish in Wausau, primarily engaged with ministry to the area's Hispanic community. He'll have similar responsibilities in Plover. Fr. Sebastian Kolodziejczyk, the new St. Matthew pastor, speaks Spanish and will continue that ministry at St. Matthew.

Another result of this sudden turn of events is that Fr. Sam Martin, Holy Name's pastor, and I won't be taking on extra school chaplain duties as we had planned. And, Fr. Mark Pierce, the Resurrection-St. Michael pastor, has assured me that he and Fr. Mashak will be available to offer me a break by filling in for the 6 p.m. Sunday Mass on occasion. They might also preside at Lord's Day Masses when I'm on vacation.

So, everything is right with this little piece of the world. More or less. For now.

HAVING A PRIEST to preside isn't the only need or concern as we consider our Lord's Day worship. Yes, we need a priest to lead that worship, but we also need other ministers — readers, servers, music ministers, welcome ministers and eucharistic ministers. As with the presence of a priest, we often take for

granted that people will be available to serve in these roles. The reality of late, however, is quite the opposite of that expectation. At several Saturday Masses this summer we have come close to starting Mass without readers. Servers are in woefully short supply. We have celebrated Sunday night Masses without music ministers. Staff members have stepped in to greet worshipers and help gather the collection. Many of our ministers are called upon nearly every week to serve in their ministry and sometimes take on multiple roles. At a recent 6 p.m. Mass the lone reader had just finished leading the General Intercessions when she also needed to immediately begin gathering the collection.

Some of these realities are due to summer and lingering consequences of the pandemic. Some Masses bring their own challenges. Acclimating to our renovated church has delayed recruiting and training new ministers. However the overall and rather desperate need for more ministers will be addressed as we move into fall. There was already an encouraging response to a recent appeal and orientation for eucharistic ministers. Orientation will be offered in September for new and returning welcome ministers, for new servers and readers. Watch for details. In addition, people who might help to lead the assembly in song are always encouraged to step forward and let us know of your willingness and interest.

These issues are not unique to St. Anne. Several pastors tell me they are experiencing the same challenges. Please consider how you might help us address them. **TL**
