
days, at Mass in different places with different communities, and two very different experiences of being welcomed. Or not welcomed, as the case may be.


Back in June I accompanied my parents to a farewell Mass for their pastor who was returning to India. At that point it was much easier for my dad to get around in a wheelchair – he has progressed considerably since then, I am happy to report – and so we made our way to the front door. The doors were



closed and there was no one to open them; nor any switches to activate a door opener. My mom with her cane held open the door as I wheeled in my dad.

There were quite a few people milling about the entranceway, but no one clearly charged with greeting. We made our way into the church and I looked around, trying to figure out a good place to situate someone in a wheelchair. A woman holding a Lectionary, the book from which we proclaim the readings at Mass, seemed to possess some authority, so I asked her if there was a good spot for someone in a wheelchair. "Boy, we don't usually have people in wheelchairs," she said, which of course can't be true. She then pointed to a back corner. I thanked her, but suggested we could certainly do better than that. Profession of Faith (The Apostles' Creed)




FALL BOOK CLUB: In

Welcoming WELCOME MINISTERS

We hope you'll join our existing crew of excellent Welcome Ministers. Orientation for new and veteran Welcome Ministers will be at 5 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 15 in church. Please consider this need and your participation.

Michigan. My friend Chris and I went to the parish in Clare. As we approached the church, there was someone greeting us with an open door. In the gathering space there were four ministers handing out worship aids and offering words of welcome. And, beyond them, yet more ministers holding open doors to the main body of the church.

It was an excellent foreshadowing of the engaging spirit of worship we'd experience throughout the celebration of Mass.

I SHARE THESE VERY DIFFERENT experiences for reasons you may have already surmised. How we welcome people and how those who join us for Mass feel welcomed, are of crucial importance. Opening the door for someone in a wheelchair is an obvious necessity. Welcoming someone with a friendly greeting and attitude is basic hospitality. It is all essential!

We recognize the importance of hospitality at St. Anne. We strive to provide for our parishioners and visitors what Chris and I experienced at that parish in Michigan. Often people who come to join the parish, when I ask why they settled upon St. Anne, will mention how welcomed they felt when they came to Mass for the first time. What if we hadn't done very

> well on that day and at that Mass, I wonder. Might they have joined another parish?

I recently received an email from someone from Eau Claire who'd worshiped with us and was full of compliments for various ministers and the skill with which they performed their ministries, as well as the "beautifully designed

church interior." But, as she noted, it's first impressions that matter, and her first impression was that of a "friendly greeter."

The importance of these ministers is obvious. To ensure that others have similar, positive first impressions, and that all of us feel welcomed when we come to Mass, we need new and more people to assist as Welcome Ministers. Also known as "ushers" or "ministers of hospitality," I have taken to calling them *Welcome Ministers* because that speaks directly to their first and most significant role – welcoming that woman from Eau Claire, my parents with limited mobility, a pastor from Wisconsin on vacation, or you.

There will be orientation for new and veteran Welcome Ministers on Thursday at 5 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. in church. All adults and teens are invited and encouraged to join those who already serve our parish so well in this ministry. We look forward to welcoming you on Thursday so that you'll be ready to welcome those who join us for Mass. **TL**
