
We do not need to do what they did or even mirror their relationship with God. Each one of us is God's special creation, with a purpose and soul known only to us. We need to learn how to open up and bring, without compromise, our soulness to life. We know when someone is authentic and centered because they always point to truth, even though they struggle and sin themselves, and they embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and it astonished many who listened. We do not need to move mountains, advance a cause, write books or become notable. All we have to do is become credible witnesses of the faith we profess. Moses people can teach us how to do this.

St. Oscar Romero was an amazing man and a Moses figure for sure. He saw God in the burning bush and brought the flame of Gospel faith to the poorest of the poor, challenging the evils of the society in which he lived. He was tireless and persistent. He must have gotten very close to the problem because it cost him his life. He suspected it would. St. Romero said, "When we leave Mass, we ought to go out the way Moses descended Mt Sinai: with his face shining, with his heart brave and strong to face the world's difficulties." We can learn from this wisdom. If we allow the power of the Mass to truly transform us, we will leave that holy encounter changed. Our face will shine, and we will have courage. We can then bring what we have received to life's challenges. That sounds doable, doesn't it? Because of the example of our simple holiness, people will be amazed.

Greetings from the Pastor

A week ago, a young lady called and said she would like to be a lector. She came to see me and I gave her a kind of reading practice on 'church reading'. I was very impressed. But what she told me was even more impressive and even humbling. The young lady said she had received many helps from this parish of Sacred Heart, especially financial help for her daughter's education in a Catholic school. Now she has a job, and she thought of returning what she received and what she continues to receive in some manner. One way she thought of was by being a lector on Sunday.

When I was in India, more than a decade ago, at a parish of St. Jude, a pilgrim place famous for novena to St. Jude on every Monday, an older gentleman came to see me. He said his son used to participate in Mass and novena, the intention of which being going abroad for a better living. His son made many attempts, but would lose at the very end of exams and interviews. He was disheartened. He made a promise to the Lord that if he got a chance to go to Britain as a nurse, he would send the first month's whole salary to the Church of St. Jude as a thanksgiving for the favors received.

Months went by. He got through all the interviews. He successfully ended up in Britain as a nurse. He received his first salary. As he got his first salary, he thought of the shrine of St. Jude, all the Masses and novenas he participated and the promise he had made to the Lord. He kept his promise by sending the whole salary of the month, not using even a dime for his personal needs. As the older man placed the sum of money, he said, "We received so many blessings from the Lord through the intercession of St. Jude. We are bound to return at least this much to the Lord. Please use this money for whatever you might need for the parish." As the man waved goodbye and walked away, I could only imagine the faith of that young man, doing some night shift in some hospital, thousands of miles away.

Maybe, many of you do not realize the importance of the role of this parish in your life and in the life of your family. If you ever get motivated to return the gifts of the Lord, spiritual or material, to the Lord in any way, you have numerous opportunities. Give us a call, or stop by anytime. We will be happy to guide you. Being a lector, a PSR teacher, an Extra-ordinary minister of the Eucharist, an usher, an altar server, a gardener, an adorer of the Blessed Sacrament, volunteer of any sort ... Possibilities of returning the gifts are far more than dropping your Sunday collection.

"But who am I, and who are my people, that we should have the means to contribute so freely? For everything is from you, and what we give you is what we have from you. From before you, we are strangers and travelers, like all our ancestors. Our days on earth are like a shadow, without a future. Lord our God, all this wealth that we have brought together to build you a house for your holy name comes from you and is entirely ours" (1 Chronicles 29:14-16).






