

5th Sunday of Easter


“Spiraling out of control,” is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that “feelings” have become a “new god” and traditional structures and ideals set aside. It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checkered past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God’s life.

Giving up our will to God’s can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God’s commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be “human freedom.” They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived. We will not know peace.

Greetings from the Pastor

I started my India-bound journey around 11 am. The first stop was at my priest friend's, at Hazelwood. He brewed a strong tea – too strong – and we sipped together. Then he took me to the airport, just 6 minutes away from him. The lady at the desk knew nothing about how to check an Indian in on an American airline that had a code sharing with Qatar Airline. Well, she made numerous calls before she completed the formalities, I mean, Pandemic protocols and, sure enough, thanked me for my patients. Announcements were made about the need of physical distancing over the P A system. But half an hour later, inside the aircraft, there was no physical distancing! Its all about money.

At Chicago, I waited for the fifteen-hour long, non-stop flight to Doha. Thankfully, they practiced physical distancing also inside the aircraft. There I sat alone in a right side row of three seats. There was none ahead of me, none behind me, and none in left row. The crew were extremely courteous, were happy to have their customers on board. They seemed to tell that customers sustained any business. They served great meals, three times, over the length of the trip. Sleep avoided me much, and I forced myself to watch three movies to kill time. At some point, I dosed off while the huge Qatar giant cruised on 41 thousand feet high at a speed of around 480 miles per hour. Then came the much awaited announcement from the cockpit by the middle-eastern pilot, whose English was much like mine, hard to understand. But I picked up what I wanted to hear, that the flight was starting to descent. A short while later, I could see the ocean with many luxury boats floating over it. Then the beautiful city of Doha and the Hamad International Airport that lie by the ocean came into sight.

I had three hours of lay-over at Doha. Well, I needed that length to brush my stinking teeth, and to take a shave. I looked around for a restaurant that served beer. And I paced, no kidding, 4500 steps inside the terminal with my alcohol desire. Then I realized that it was Ramadan month, and none of the restaurants there served any alcoholic beverages. Then it dawned on me that I had with me in my hand luggage a few sample bottles of Bacardi rum that I picked up from Schuncks, the previous day! I bought a small bottle of water, drank to empty it to half, mixed a rum in it and drank before I checked into my next leg of the trip.

The young lady strenuously called my last name over the PA system to go to the desk. She issued a new boarding pass and I looked at it. She had freely upgraded me into business class! The last leg of the journey was the most pleasant. I travelled like a millionaire in the luxurious Qatar Business Class. I reached home, safely home, with your many prayers, I know. Thanks. I quarantined myself for a few days at my sister's house. There is a six-year-old nephew here scanning at my boxes to know if there was something for him from the US. I should unpack my box to pull out a few things I bought for this kiddo. Hope you are well. I am thinking of you.

Question:
Is gossip a mortal sin?

Answer:

To really ask this question, we must consider the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness." In its reflections on this commandment, The Catechism of the Catholic Church invites us to not only think about what bearing "false witness" means, but to also consider how we understand the truth and how we communicate more broadly. This is why so much of this section of the Catechism has to do with the gift of language. With this in mind, we will notice that the word "gossip" isn't used by the Catechism. Instead, we find the words "detraction" and "calumny," which are actually two forms that gossip can take, and both can be quite serious.

First, detraction is the of revealing "another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them," without morally valid reasons. Calumny, by extension, is saying something about another person that is untrue, and it is sinful because it "harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgements" (see no. 2477).

In all of our communication, we have to always recognize that we have a moral obligation to the truth and to always work to protect the reputation and honor of our neighbors (see no. 2479).

Women are denied critical information on the risks of an abortion, including increased risk of Breast Cancer, Post Abortion Syndrome, the sale of body parts etc.

The truth about abortion has been censored by the media, silenced by our courts, politicized by our politicians and even silenced in our churches and schools. Babies in the womb have no voice except yours and mine. We cannot remain silent any longer.

Branching Out Isn't Always What It's Cracked Up to Be

"That's a really beautiful tree branch. Man, would you look at the bark on that thing? The others are real duds, but that low-hanging branch has really got it all together."

I've never heard anyone say this. Maybe I just need to hang out with more arborists, but I can't recall ever hearing someone admire the particular beauty of a single branch. When someone comments on a tree, it's usually the whole tree — perhaps a visual element of it, like the color of the leaves or its height. But people don't usually zero in on one branch.

Maybe that's because usually, if one branch is looking a little weak, chances are every other branch is, too.

The Bible tells us that when we bear fruit as good everyday stewards, it is for the Father's glory. We are the branch on His magnificent tree. What we have is from Him, and what we do likewise points back to Him. We also tend to reflect how well the other branches around us are incorporating the nutrients coming their way. That's all fine and good in theory. In practice, it can be an arduous exercise in humility.

When I do something virtuous or charitable or kind, there is a part of me that wants to stand out for it. I think that's true for all of us. We've given of ourselves in some way or overcome some human temptation to accomplish a little bit of good in this world, and even though we know God sees us, we'd really love for everyone else to see it, too.

It's a struggle, for sure. But we need to remember that our fruit belongs to the whole tree.






