### Pentecost Sunday

Begin by taking a moment to calm yourself, focus on your breathing and become aware of the life force that flows through your veins. Center yourself in the words and affections of St. Augustine's Prayer to the Holy Spirit, "Breath in me, O Holy Spirit, that my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, that my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, that I love but what is holy. Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, to defend all that is holy. Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit, that I may always be holy." Sanctifying, bringing things to wholeness, blessing, restoring and creating are just some of the fruits of the presence of the Holy Spirit. Being filled with the Holy Spirit is not always about proclaiming loud cries of praise or singing alleluia from a rooftop. It is about unfolding and encountering the ordinary in an extraordinary way. Being filled with the Holy Spirit means being filled with the fullness of God's life and in touch with the power and wonder of God's presence. It's about becoming holy.

It is not just for saints or people who have a religious vocation. Holiness is for the ordinary, simple run-of-the-mill person who desires to love God, others, and all of creation. When an ordinary, humble person becomes connected with life and the wondrous power of God's love, they begin to live life more deeply, a bit more reverently, desire a simple fare and find themselves relishing in ordinary beauty. Their senses become attuned to the Author of life and they realize that they are not alone. The Holy Spirit connects all of the dots of human experience and existence, bringing everyone to center on the Divine Presence. The Holy Spirit does not just breathe "on me" but "in me" and is the force behind every breath I take. Take a moment to soak that thought in. There is the Divine Presence of the Holy Spirit in me, right now. When a person becomes in touch with truth, they know that when inspired by the Holy Spirit, his or her actions are not solely their own. They realize that they are moved by Divine Grace and drawn to things not found in secular affairs.

We live in a world where it is hard to discover truth. Real truth is veiled by so many imposters that it is hard to find, especially for those who are young. It is easy to be fooled and duped and often, without full conscious awareness of doing so, we choose to walk down a path of self-absorption and destruction. It is only the Holy Spirit, through the ministry of the church most especially, who guides us to truth and shows us the way to be the graced and holy human beings God made us to be. The wonders and inspirations of today's Feast of Pentecost are necessary to share with both those we love and those who only casually cross our paths. The first disciples, touched by the Holy Spirit, brought the Gospel to the ends of the earth one-step at a time. Is it unrealistic to ask that we assist in that same mission by helping people understand who they are and who God is one at a time? Ask the Holy Spirit to alleviate the fear in your heart that prevents you from doing so.

### Greetings from the Pastor

"I write to you, young men and women, because you are strong,  
and the word of God lives in you, and you have overcome the evil  
one." (1 John 2:14)

It is time to focus a little more on the youth of our parish.

Do we have any youth at all, you might wonder! Isn't our parish an  
older parish? You might ask. We hardly see any young ones at  
Mass on the weekends, you might say. True. Our parish is an older  
parish; we don't see many youths at Mass any more. But that  
doesn't mean that we do not have youths in our parish. We have. For example, we  
had sixteen candidates for confirmation this past year. We had seven or eight the  
year before. we have almost a similar number this coming year. And I now person-  
ally many youths who go to Mass at Sacred Heart. That means, we have many  
youths and young adults. It is time to look for them and gather them.

I need your help. The future of the parish depends largely on the youths,  
whom we need to gather, of our parish. I am planning to launch a 'youth ministry'  
at least in theory. Currently, we don't have a platform for our youths to stay con-  
nected with the parish and spiritual life, especially after graduating. The plan is to  
create a space for them to get together on our ground. Before we hire a youth min-  
ister, or choke out a clear schedule and plan, we need to reach out to the scattered  
youths of our parish and gather them. We need to know how many are willing to  
cooperate with the efforts of the parish as we move forward with the formation of  
the youths. If we can have even a small number to start with, that would be a real  
start, and we can take on from there.

My plan is to gather our youths once a week for an hour or two on a day  
that is most suitable to most of them who would be coming. We will ask their sug-  
gestion on what they like to do, or how to maneuver the program. We can start with  
group gatherings, some praise and worship, or some sort of games; we can end the  
day with a dinner. We can take them on pilgrimages, near or far, on mission trips,  
projects like community service of their interests; we can conduct camps for them  
(these are just a few thoughts I have to start with). And if we have a considerable  
number of youths, then we can think about hiring a youth minister. I would like to  
know your opinion.

I would request all parents, especially PSR families, with children eighth  
grade and above to encourage their children to be part of this new initiative of the  
parish for the good of your children and of the parish. I request any young adults  
interested in helping the parish in any way in this matter to contact the parish of-  
fice. I will be reaching out to each family with youths personally inviting them to  
our new youth ministry.


### Catholic Vs. Protestant Bibles

#### Question:

Why are Catholic and Protestant Bibles different?

#### Answer:

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians used a Greek translation of the Old Tes-  
tament known as the Septuagint. This collection of the texts of the Hebrew Scriptures  
included 46 books. At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 1500s, the Protestant  
reformers began to create their own translations of the Bible (into local languages) and  
some began to question why the Jewish Scriptures would have included texts that were  
written in Greek, because, they assumed, the only valid Jewish Scriptures would have  
been written in Hebrew. And so, they decided to remove seven books from the Old Tes-  
tament: Baruch, Sirach, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Tobit, Judith and Wisdom (as well as por-  
tions of the Books of Daniel and Esther). This means that the Protestant Old Testament  
only includes 39 books, while Catholic Bibles continue to include those original 46  
books. Both Catholic and Protestant Bibles include 27 books and letters in the New Tes-  
tament.



**EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**

**You Don't Have What It Takes — but You Will**

Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.

We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we're supposed to do, in any situation. It's that feeling of: *Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can't.*

We've all got our list of reasons why not, don't we? We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I'm not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don't want to come across as pushy. I'm not going to make amends with my cousin because she'll just walk all over me again. I'm not going to say a Rosary tonight because I'm tired and it'll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of "reasons why we can't" together, I don't think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles. Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven't been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages. Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades?

But even that big, giant, stop-you-dead-in-your tracks Reason Why We Can't was nothing, because God had a plan. He didn't call a bunch of equipped men. He called them, and He equipped them. Cue the tongues of fire!

God doesn't call us to do His will because we have what it takes. He calls us because He's ready to give us what it takes. Being a good steward is to answer the call of Christ knowing he will provide.

## Dynamic Catholic, Alive! – Pentecost- Gifts of the Holy Spirit

What an extraordinary event the first Pentecost was! Fortunately, it continues today as we experience the continued action of the Holy Spirit in prayer and the moments of daily life. We often refer to Pentecost as the birthday of the Church because it is the first moment when the Apostles formed a community of believers and, led by the Holy Spirit, began to invite others to become followers of Jesus Christ. How often we forget the power of the Sacrament of Confirmation that we have received. The Lord sends the gifts of the Holy Spirit into our hearts, giving us wisdom, knowledge, understanding, counsel, fortitude, piety, and fear of the Lord. 


