We spend so much time storming heaven with our agenda and trying to make God into a "god" of our desires that we do not hear God saying, "Listen to me!" God is desperately trying to get our attention. God is saying, I am here among you as not one but three, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Many people seldom notice God's presence because they are so caught up with other spiritual cares and concerns. And, when the "god" they fashion and create doesn't produce as they desire, they shake the dust from their feet and move on. "I tried," they exclaim, "but God didn't listen."

Healthy relationships aren't built on making someone be who we need them to be. Healthy relationships are built on encounters of persons and the development of an appreciation of someone solely for who they are. Deeper relationships can even be found with two people marveling at each other and almost experiencing a childlike joy and giddiness when they see the other coming. Do you ever have these feelings about God? Believe it or not, God does for you! There is a joyful laughter that gives rise to and connects all three members of the Holy Trinity. It is this laughter, flowing from the very depths of the Godhead that not only keeps the Trinity in joyful unity but spills over into the creation of all beings and things. It is an expression of Divine Delight! Have you ever taken time away from your agenda to experience the Divine Joyfulness of God?

We can reach a connection of Presence wherein even the smallest of creatures suddenly radiate the fullness of God: the wonderful creation of their being, the innocence and playfulness of their movements, and the sustaining life breath that flows through their veins. The same God who created the heavens and the earth is the same God who wants you to call him 'Dad' and the same God who preserves your life and has all things in His care.

Greetings from the Pastor

I stood by a memorial wall; I read the caption, *All gave some, some gave all*. I could picture the lives of those valiant souls who lived and died, even before I was born, for the nation. Haven't you seen memorials of unknown soldiers who died somewhere in a far corner from his native land, who never returned home? Have you ever tried to understand what was going through their mind, at the point of death, knowing that they would never again see their loved ones who were waiting for them to return home -maybe newly wedded? Perhaps, you haven't.

They were almost sure they would never see their land again, would never hold their newborn child even for one time, would never kiss his wife again, and would never be with their loved ones again. Amid Cold and heat, shells and bombs, with fingers always on the trigger without even winking their eyes, day and night, they kept watch for you. While you and your family blissfully slept in the comfort and safety of your homes, there was a group of people in military bunks who pledged themselves to sit awake to protect you and your family. They are not today to enjoy the day, with beer and barbecue, which we celebrate in memory of those valiant but fallen soldiers. It is their day, not ours. The day you celebrate is their bounty.

Each man and woman who fell down in the line of duty is a shining star up in the sky. When we make merry here on earth, remember that our smile is the result of their struggles and sweat. The Memorial Day is an apt honor the nation pays for those brave souls who safeguarded the dignity and protected your land. As we remember them with gratitude, we should also pledge ourselves to follow their example of sacrifice, dedication, determination and discipline, which the new generation might have lost to some degree. Although, you may not give all, you can give at least some!

At the Last supper, the Lord said to his disciples, "do this in memory of me". The Eucharist we celebrate is the *memorial* of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord; it is the, 'memorial' of the *sacrifice* of the Lord for us. The Eucharist becomes a living experience for us when we appreciate what the Lord has done for us on the cross - the ultimate sacrifice. Every Sunday thus becomes a 'memorial day' of the Lord.

Those men and women who even today live with physical and emotional scars, wounds and traumas of those days in the service might forget the nightmare for a moment when they see the national flag fluttering high. The ripples of the flag in the breeze that huddles them is the reward they receive for their told and untold sacrifices for the nation. Celebrate the Memorial Day without forgetting the numerous sacrifices of our heroes. Move a finger to build up the nation with your life.

It is not only celebrating the Memorial Day that was born of the sacrifices of the valiant, but also reliving those sacrifices that made you into 'ONE NATION, UNDER GOD, INDIVISIBLE, WITH LIBERTY AND JUSTICE FOR ALL'. They gave us a day with their life and service to celebrate. What would you leave behind for the generation coming after you to celebrate with? As the blood of the martyrs became the seed of the Church, which sprouted and grew up in a soil soaked by the blood of martyrs, so does the nation, built upon the lives of people who fought for the country. We tearfully salute the fallen, and gratefully remember their contribution. Happy Memorial Day.





Dynamic Catholic, Alive! – Most Holy Trinity- The Triune God

I have often heard priests tell me that this solemnity is one of the most difficult days in the liturgical year on which to preach a good homily. It is difficult to preach a homily on such a central mystery of our faith like the Trinity. What is essential to remember for all Catholics is to simply listen to the readings and each of the prayers today for the Mass. Within these texts we can find spiritual insights about the Trinity. For example, the preface for the Mass today provides a great summary of the Church's teaching on the mystery of the Trinity: "For what you have revealed to us of your glory we believe equally of your Son and of the Holy Spirit, so that, in the confessing of the true and eternal Godhead, you might be adored in what is proper to each Person, their unity in substance, and their equality in majesty." One God in three Persons is always there for us.
