When we see God with true sincerity of heart and God passes us along our way, it is only then that we will be able to cry out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" We have to truly want to be healed by, and in union with, God in order for us to reach out to him. If God is only an abstract idea, theory, or someone found in the pages of a book, there is no motivation for a relationship and no desire to seek him. God needs to be real in order for faith to be real. It's all about the journey.

St. Augustine reminds us that "to fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek Him the greatest adventure; to find Him the greatest human achievement." We strive after many things and mercy is not always one of them. We think that we can find fulfillment and healing in other things only to discover that we are still short and empty. From the moment human beings were created, God has been calling us and seeking us. He has been walking right beside the human story from the minute He first breathed life into the first human soul. Are we able to recognize God as He walks with us? At some point we have to realize that there is only one way to satisfy the deepest longings of the human heart and that is in relationship with our Creator. We are called to this. However, we make the huge error of thinking that what we are hearing is coming from somewhere else. We become confused. Every human being would certainly profit with wisdom if they realized Who calls them and to Whom they belong.

Then and only then will we realize that it is only our Divine Master who can give us true vision and heal us. Once we recognize and reach out for the merciful presence of our loving Maker, we will be able to see with our soul, understanding the true nature and depth of all things. God's mercy is always available. It doesn't matter how far we have strayed or how blind we become, God patiently waits to console us, guide us and heal us. All we need to do is desire Him. Once we reach out, we also realize that there is no greater love to be found than God's, no human adventure that comes even close to the thrill of a spiritual search, and no human achievement even remotely as satisfying as union with Him. This is where we belong. This is salvation.

### Greetings from the Pastor

A few years ago, I had the great opportunity to tour around the Grand Canyons. It is difficult to recall how long I stood looking at the imposing beauty and the awesomeness of the Canyon. Neither can I say how many times I went back and forth, in that short trip, to gaze repeatedly at the grandeur of the Grand Canyons. I felt like being there longer. It was like what St. Peter suggested: Lord, it is good for us to be here; let me make three tents. I was simply enraptured in the thrill of what I was seeing. Then I thought, the author of this worldly beauty must be far more beautiful than Grand Canyons, and heaven must be much more desirable than this place.

I took a trek into the abyss of the canyon, to the brink of the Colorado River that spiraled along the valley, by the bank of which many people camped over night. As I stood there, in the bottom of the gigantic mountains around me, and looked up and around the gargantuan beauty that surrounded me, I could not but simply praise God for His handiwork. And it was time for me to trek back laboriously into the actuality. As I trod the winding trail up, I carved on one of the rocks with a rock GOD BLESS AMERICA.

I sat down on a rock, a little away from the trail. Trekkers with backpacks and walking sticks ascended and descended. But I wondered how many of them knew that the land they were walking on was sea once upon a time! Well, the great beauty that surrounded them and me had been hidden under some mighty sea. The sea had to recede for the Grand Canyon of grandiose beauty to appear.

Many a time, the real beauty of a person is hidden beneath and behind what seems to be a rough and rugged life. We may have to wait patiently, sometimes many years, for the hidden beauty of life to emerge. The longer I looked at the Canyon, greater was the beauty, I thought. And I knew I could not exhaust the beauty ever; neither does one trip suffice to enjoy the pleasure of looking at it. So too with finding the inner beauty of a person. We may have to look deeper into ourselves and others; we may have to go down the trials of life; we may have to visit more often into the inner canyons of life to appreciate the beauty of our life which on the surface might look rough.

Haven't you noticed some couples, as they get older in their life together as husband and wife, being more attached? That is because, they have learned to appreciate the inner beauty of the other; they trek into abyss of their life together; they drink from the stream of love that still spirals through crackles of their lives together. As sea retreated revealing the Grand Canyon to the world, rough shells of our outer life should wither away revealing the inner beauty, as years go by. Look repeatedly into that beauty; learn to appreciate life.

## Communion & Mortal Sin

### Question:

I have a friend who receives communion, but who I know for a fact is in a state of mortal sin. Should I tell our priest? Is it my responsibility to say something?

### Answer:

While we may always want to do what is best for our friends and family members, we have a responsibility to respect their privacy and their conscience. In its reflections on the Eighth Commandment (“You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor”), the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury. [One] becomes guilty: -of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor; -of detraction who, without objectively valid reason, discloses another’s faults and failings to persons who do not know them; of calumny who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments concerning them” (no. 2477).

We will never truly know what is in a person’s mind, heart, and soul; only God knows those things. We should, of course, take our concerns to God and entrust the person about whom we are concerned to God’s grace and mercy. If we have concerns about the spiritual wellbeing of someone with whom we are close, we should go to the person themselves and talk about our fears and concerns. Unless it is a case of abuse or endangerment (which we have a moral and even legal responsibility to report to the appropriate authorities), we ultimately do not have the freedom to share another’s persons faults or sins, however good we think our intentions might be.

## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

### Giving as God does

Ask yourself this question — what would you pray for if you really believed God could and would do anything for you? In my experience, we all have something. We all have that miracle we're afraid to request, afraid we will be disappointed.

Do we doubt God's readiness to give because we ourselves have such an imperfect understanding of charity and love? Maybe if we had better faith in God we would be more ready to give of ourselves — and maybe if we were more ready to give of ourselves, we would understand more clearly the ways of God.

Because we're not really afraid that God can't do something. We know He can do anything. What we're afraid of is that He will do what He always does: give us what we need, not what we want.

Have you ever had a friend in need and you just wanted to give them something — a meal, a phone call, a text? Not because you knew it would help, but simply because you wanted to reach out. And have they ever said to you: It wasn't so much what you gave, but the fact that you did. You gave them what they needed even if it wasn't what they specifically asked for.

When we give in this manner, we are giving as God does. Sometimes we are afraid to ask because we don't want to be disappointed. But remember, the blind man on the road got what he asked for, but he would have gotten what he needed even if his answer had been the opposite. God's generosity is always reckless, and it's always perfect.

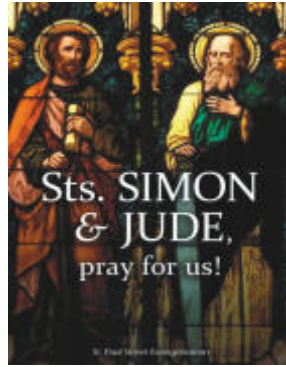
