FIRST RECONCILIATION

What are your memories of the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Or should I say, the Sacrament of Penance? Or perhaps, I should ask, what are your memories when you first went to Confession? Depending on your age and religious education one of these terms might resonate more with you.

They all — Reconciliation, Penance, Confession — refer to this Sacrament of Healing. The Catechism of the Catholic Church described two major elements of the sacrament, *our actions* and *God's actions*. The sacrament encompasses our expressions of being sorry for the ways we have hurt others (and ourselves) or transgressed against God and confessing this to the priest. It is also about God's actions of forgiveness toward us.

This coming week many of our children will experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. You, like me, may be someone who remembers this sacrament kneeling in a dark confessional, unable to see the priest you were talking with because he was hidden behind a screen. Your memories might bring back some anxiety or fear the experience harbored in you.

We hope, and believe, that the memories of our children experiencing their First Reconciliation this week will predominantly be of a new awareness of God's love and forgiveness.

We prepare our children first to begin to form their conscience. That is, to become aware of how we each can hurt others with our words and deeds and how we can fall short of loving God through our lack of devotion, prayer or respect for God's laws. We teach them the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes. They learn the Act of Contrition prayer.

In preparation for Reconciliation, the child's parents are given a white cloth to decorate with symbols and words to remind their child of the day they celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Parents put this stole-like cloth over their child's shoulders and give them a hug as they complete their personal confession with the priest.

This sacrament is celebrated in a spirit opposite of the fearful experience I remember. In fact, last year, we had several priests, in stations around the church. One little fellow, when he finished his confession with Fr. Tony, had moved onto two other priests before we noticed he was having his "confessional conversation" with each priest. I guess he was having a good experience!

Hopefully, as the children of our parish celebrate their First Reconciliation, they are learning God's love and forgiveness is greater than we can imagine. God does not dwell on our unfortunate or poor choices. God offers us mercy and another chance. And may it be a reminder that we are all called to forgive others as we have been forgiven and keep in our heart the insight in the words of St. Francis, "It is in pardoning we are pardoned."

Congratulations to our children and their families who will celebrate their First Reconciliation. Thank you to Fr. Tony and his brother priests who represent God's love and forgiveness to our children.






