

St. Sebastian

Little is known about Sebastian's childhood—he probably came from southern France, and was educated in Milan. In the year 283, he joined the Roman Army to be of service to other Christians who were being persecuted. Due to his distinguished service, he was promoted to serve in the Praetorian Guard protecting Emperor Diocletian.

While serving as a Praetorian Guard, Sebastian helped several people convert to Christianity. There were 2 deacons imprisoned—twin brothers Marcus and Marcellian—and Sebastian convinced their parents to convert. He also converted the local prefect, among others.

In the year 286, Sebastian was reported to Emperor Diocletian as a Christian. The Emperor ordered him to die tied to a stake and used as target practice on a training field.

Many arrows struck Sebastian, and the archers left his body for retrieval and burial. Irene of Rome discovered that he was still alive. Her husband was a servant to Diocletian. She nursed Sebastian back to health.

Sebastian went back and confronted Diocletian, criticizing him publicly for his persecution of Christians. Stunned that Sebastian was alive, Diocletian ordered his former guard to be beaten to death with clubs and thrown into the sewer. Lucina, a Christian woman, recovered his body and secretly buried him in the catacombs beneath Rome.

Pope Damasus I had Sebastian's remains moved to a basilica in Rome around 367. Relics were removed and given to a group of monks in France. His cranium was sent to a German monastery and placed in a silver case—the relic

is still in its case today in a reliquary in Ebersberg.

St. Sebastian was often invoked as a protector against the plague—he is said to have defended the city of Rome against the plague in 680. He is the patron saint of soldiers, athletes, and those who desire a saintly death. His feast day is January 20.
