

Rob'servations

Dear Friends—

Of the four Gospels, Luke alone—whose account of Jesus' passion and death we hear today—reports Jesus' words just as he's crucified: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."

This Lent, most of us have examined our conscience and received sacramental reconciliation after confessing our sins. Repentance involves facing up to the ways we have harmed ourselves, or our relationships with God and others. Jesus' words from

the cross suggest that his saving love reaches even beyond the sins we know, to the damage we have caused unwittingly in this fallen world.

In both St. Vincent's and Sacred Heart Churches, you will find an image of Mary holding the child Jesus, known as the icon of Our Lady (or Our Mother) of Perpetual Help. The picture on this page is the one in Sacred Heart Church, which was handpainted by a Canadian iconographer for our community. This image invites us to reflect on the unknown consequences of our sins, the ripple effect beyond what even our conscience normally sees. We know not what we do.

The icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, like many Byzantine-style icons, shows mother Mary holding the child Jesus. Her sorrowful gaze looks out at you, as her right hand gestures toward her child. In many icons of Mary and baby Jesus, his gaze is directed at his mother. But not here. In this image, Jesus is not looking at Mary but at the archangel Gabriel, who along with the archangel Michael hovers over Mary's shoulders. Gabriel holds the cross, and Michael holds the reed with a vinegar-soaked sponge and the spear that would pierce his side. Jesus' expression looks concerned and fearful as he beholds the instruments of his passion.

One of the most striking details about this image is Jesus' sandal on his right foot—the strap has broken, and the sandal is dangling.

What does it all mean? According to the story behind the icon, supposedly as a young child Jesus was at home playing one day. Suddenly, for the first time in his human life, he became aware of his mission, and had a vision of what he would suffer. This is what the angels holding the cross, sponge, and spear represent.

Just think of it: On the first Holy Thursday, Jesus experienced great agony as he awaited those who would arrest him in the Garden of Gethsemane. At that point he was a strong, capable man, who had had years to contemplate what he would have to do to forgive human sin. And despite this, he was still filled with fear and anxiety. Luke says that Jesus "was in such agony and he prayed so fervently that his sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground."

Horrible for a grown man to confront. And how much more horrible for a child. According to the story

behind the icon, when the child Jesus had this vision of the passion, he was overcome with sadness and fear. He got up and ran—ran so fast and suddenly that his sandal strap broke. And he ran to the greatest source of comfort any small child knows: his mother.

What is the meaning of the icon? It invites us to meditate on the child Jesus as running from the cross. Well, what put Jesus on the cross? You might say the corrupt Jewish leaders, the crowds that shouted for his crucifixion, or Pontius Pilate and the Roman government. But even deeper than these, the power that

rejected and killed the Son of God was human sin. And not just the sin of those who loved long ago, but your sin, my sin. So what is the meaning of the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help? In this image, the child Jesus is afraid of the cross. He is afraid of me.

And despite this, his mother looks out at me. Sorrow is in her eyes, but she is not angry. She knows that, with her love, Jesus will grow and "advance in wisdom and age and favor before God and man" (Luke 2:52). She knows that, one day, he will face the cross and not run away. She knows that she will lose her son because of my sin, and—even if I never think of her sorrow and his agony—he will still love and forgive me. We know that Jesus suffered for us, but can any of us say we really know how much he suffered? And despite this, he loves us and calls on his Father to forgive us. "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."

May you have a blessed Holy Week this year. May you enter deeply into the meaning of Jesus' suffering and death, that you may truly know his forgiveness and experience at Easter an even deeper joy.






