





KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS CHALK DISTRIBUTION

The Knights of Columbus will be distributing packets of blessed chalk to be inscribed on the front doors of your home on the Feast of the Epiphany (1/2/22). A time-honored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors" is a simple formula. Adapted for 2022: take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 22.

The "+" signs represent the cross while the letters represent the initials of the Magi—Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar—who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus Mansionem Benedicat: "May Christ bless this house."

It encourages Christians to dedicate their life at home to God and to others. These symbols remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ. We should strive to be as welcoming to all who come to our homes to visit us, just as the Magi did.

A WOMEN'S CHRISTMAS

There is a custom, rooted in Ireland, of celebrating Epiphany as Women's Christmas. It originated from when women, who often carried the domestic responsibilities all year, took this occasion to celebrate together at the end of the holidays. Join Firstfruits Women's Center in Elm Grove on Thursdays, January 13-27 (Zoom) and February 3 (in person) for a Women's Christmas. These four days are an invitation for you to rest, reflect, and contemplate where you are in your unfolding spiritual path. WHAT'S THIS?

Christmas Time – December 25 – January 9

...my true love sent to me...

Sing out!!! It's still Christmas!!!

So revered and important an event, the joyful and ancient Christian celebration of the birth of Christ (Christmas) was and is one we fully embrace.

Hidden in our experience of Nativity exuberance is the fulfillment of the eventual gift of the same Christ's death and Resurrection. Thus, the beauty of the experience, aside from a commercial ending, doesn't and shouldn't cease on December 25th.



This year, 2022, the liturgical feast of the Epiphany is celebrated January 2nd. In ancient times, **Christmas** was celebrated on **January 6**th – together with the Magi visit (when gifts were traditionally given to one another to emulate those presented to baby Jesus by the Magi) and the Lord's baptism. At one point, Christ's first miracle at Cana was also included on that same feast day! Known as Epiphany, this ancient festival was equivalent to the celebration of Easter.

Eastern, Western and historic traditions and customs vary. Dates for a full ending of Christmas gladness have extended from January 2 (the Octave of Christmas/Feast of Mary, the Mother of God) to February 6 (Presentation of the Lord). ... and don't forget the traditional and musical reminder: The 12 Days of Christmas!

Long after the gifts are open, plan on continued Christmas rejoicing...eight days, ten days or twenty!!

CALLED & GIFTED WORKSHOP



SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Epiphany Sunday is always a joyous time in the Church. The story of the Magi as recorded in the Gospel of Matthew is one with which we usually become familiar when we are young. This day is filled with



symbolism; it is filled with stewardship.

The prophet Isaiah, perhaps more than any other of the prophets, anticipated the coming of Christ. He foresaw details about the coming of the Messiah which are uncanny in their accuracy. It is almost as if Isaiah foresaw the glory of Christ's Epiphany. "Rise up in splendor...Your light has come...Then shall you be radiant at what you see." The light of Christ has shone and is shining upon us. However, we are to do more than just bask in it. We are to be "radiant at what we see." This is the call to stewardship; we are to take that light, that Good News, and we are to share it and spread it.

The Apostle Luke provided us with a detailed accounting of Christ's birth in Bethlehem. The visit of the Magi would seem to have occurred some time, perhaps even months, after the Lord's nativity. Their trek and visit is only mentioned in the Gospel of Matthew. Much has been written and surmised in relation to who they were, and the significance of their journey and visit.

For us as stewards it is well to take note of two important aspects of this story. When Jesus was born, it was first revealed to humble and plain shepherds. The revelation for those considered more honorable and learned, namely, the Magi, occurred much later. Another perspective is that Jesus came to the poor first, and then the rich. The point is that He came and comes to everyone, each one of us as well.

An "Epiphany" is, as normally used, a revelation. The revelation in this case, for us, and for the Magi, is the realization not only of the divinity of the Lord, but also the fact that Jesus came as the Savior of all. Those first shepherds who approached and worshiped Jesus were Jews; these Magi were Gentiles. We need to respond to this revelation, just as the Magi did.

They could have merely admired the glorious star which they saw in the sky and philosophized as to what it was and what it meant. However, they did more than that. They acted. We, too, are called to act through stewardship. We are called to more than just follow the Light of Christ. We are called to respond and to act and to do something to show that we are indeed disciples. That would make us, too, wise.


