

Welcome to all as we gather to celebrate our Savior's birth at Christmas! Because of the way Christmas falls on Saturday, Dec. 25th we have our Masses at Christmas Eve Vigil at 5:00 p.m. and Midnight Mass, then Christmas Day Masses at 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., and 12:00 p.m. here at the Cathedral. St. Mary Mission has Christmas Day Mass at 10:30 a.m. There will not be a 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday evening, as it would not be for the following Sunday of Holy Family.

Masses for the <u>Feast of the Holy Family</u> will all be on Sunday, Dec. 26th at 8:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. at the Cathedral and St. Mary's Sunday Mass at 10:30 a.m. as usual.

The <u>Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God</u> comes next Saturday, Jan. 1st with a Vigil Mass on Friday, Dec. 31st at 5:30 p.m. and Masses on Saturday, Jan. 1st at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. St. Mary's will have a Mass at 1:00 p.m. on Jan. 1st. The obligation is actually lifted for this Solemnity, but it is a wonderful way to start the New Year, and Jan. 1st is a First Saturday with its regular devotion

Again, I thank all whose work and ministry helps us lift our hearts to the Lord in worship, whether through sacred music, beautiful decorations, all the liturgical ministries and service of any kind for our Cathedral and for St. Mary Mission!




