



Dear Cathedral and St. Mary Mission Families,

We celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time this weekend, following the Lord Jesus in His mission.

This Sunday, Jan. 16<sup>th</sup> we will start offering a Sunday Mass at 4 p.m. at which masks will be required so as to encourage attendance for those who are more vulnerable. We'll give this a try for a couple months to see if this is helpful. It will be a simple Mass without singing...

This Saturday, Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup> marks the tragic anniversary of the Supreme Court decision from 1973 – Roe vs. Wade – in which abortion was made legally permitted. Since then, we know that over 60 million children have been lost to abortion and countless other women and men have suffered its effects. The annual March for Life will be held in Washington, D.C. on Friday, Jan. 21<sup>st</sup> and a busload of people from our area will be traveling to take part in this. They will be traveling back on Saturday and Sunday. I encourage you to join in a Holy Hour for Life that we will offer on Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup> at 5 p.m., following the 4 p.m. Mass. January 22<sup>nd</sup> is marked as a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children so we can intercede for this goal and ask the Lord for healing and the transformation of our culture to respect life.

Thanks to the Knights of Columbus for holding their Spaghetti dinner on Jan. 15<sup>th</sup> from 4 to 7 p.m. to raise money in support of the Care Clinic! God bless you all!

# Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from, although the servers who had drawn the water knew, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."

and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.





"There is such a wide spectrum of issues involving the protection of human life and the promotion of human dignity. Good people frequently disagree on which problems to address, which policies to adopt and how best to apply them. But for citizens and elected officials alike, the basic principle is simple: We must begin with a commitment never to intentionally kill, or collude in the killing, of any innocent human life, no matter how broken, unformed, disabled or desperate that life may seem. In other words, the choice of certain ways of acting is always and radically incompatible with the love of God and the dignity of the human person created in His image."
