



Dear Cathedral and St. Mary Mission Families,

This Sunday we celebrate the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. This Saturday, Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup> we will have marked the tragic anniversary of Roe vs. Wade, the Supreme Court decision that removed existing restrictions on abortion from 1973 to the present. Some members of our parish have traveled out to Washington, D.C. for the March for Life and will be returning this Sunday night. I hope that you will take part in the Holy Hour for Life that we'll pray this Saturday after the 4 p.m. Mass. Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup> is marked as a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, so we join in praying for this goal and for healing of all touched by abortion and to build a culture of Life.

You'll find a bulletin insert with a very fine message from Fr. Jamie Ziminiski, pastor of All Saints Parish in Gladstone. When I read it, I thought it was well done and asked Fr. Jamie for permission to copy it and share it with you. It addresses our unique situation in Michigan and our need to be united in upholding the dignity and sanctity of life even if Roe is over turned.

You'll also find a flyer in the bulletin advertising our next <u>Married Couples Dinner</u> on Feb. 5<sup>th</sup>. This is always a wonderful celebration of your Sacrament of Marriage and I hope that many of you will attend. Please sign up on the bulletin board or call our Parish Office to register.

There will also be a <u>Mass with Healing Service</u> on Tuesday, Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> at 7 p.m. As usual we'll have time for individual prayer with prayer teams in the presence of our Eucharistic Lord. Come and receive the Lord's healing love! God bless you and yours!

## Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:
