

From the Pastor's Desk

We have been exploring manifestations in our last two Sunday celebrations...Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord...the magi showing that Jesus was Messiah for all the nations and the appearance of all three divine manifestations at His encounter with John the Baptist, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And as we celebrate this 2nd Sunday in Ordinary time, we have yet another manifestation of the identity of the Son of Man, the Messiah, from the gospel of John. He, Jesus, is shown forth for the first time through His miracle of water to wine to be the One they were awaiting.

We are in Cana, a smaller village, in the area of Nazareth. Apparently His Mother Mary and Jesus have been invited to a wedding reception...even the disciples were there...the wedding would have taken about 15-20 minutes...the reception, for which the whole community would have shut down, would have lasted two or three days. It consisted of processions around the village, much feasting and, of course, much wine, the common drink. It was the responsibility of the groom to provide the

feasting including the wine for the party. And, oops, the wine has run low. Mary, alert to the young groom's embarrassing moment, speaks the concern to Jesus, who responds something like, so what, this is not my concern. It is not yet the time for me to begin my ministry. You cannot help but love Mary...she ignores His response, tells the servants to follow His directions and probably walks away...well, Jesus, I think your mother just told you it was your time, your time

to manifest who you really are, the Son of God.

"Fill the jars with water," He commands...6 stone jars each holding 20-30 gallons...always an abundance...and it produces a very good quality of wine. And, He is manifested in His divinity for the first time. The gospel says, "Jesus did this as the beginning of His signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed His glory" and then adding for them and for us, "and His disciples began to believe in Him." So, believe in Him. lieve in Him!

Getting caught up in Christ

Here's a short list of ways you can fully embrace the liturgical season of Ordinary Time and get caught up in Christ:

- 1. Examine your habits. Your day to day life is typically just a series of habits played out one after the other. If you want your life to change, the first place to look is your habits. A great new habit to start: reading the daily Gospel.
- 2. Gratitude. Joy always finds its root in gratitude. Try starting each day by thanking God for five ordinary, everyday things. If you have a family, try going around the table at dinner time and list off things together.
- 3. Use your imagination to reflect on the daily life of Jesus. Imagine Jesus doing the simple things. Eating, walking, joking with his friends. Praying. Make yourself a bystander to the Gospel stories in your imagination.

Ordinary Time is anything but ordinary. But the true power of the season is only unlocked if you live it!
