## Mission Statement

We are still on our St Luke journey of Jesus up to Jerusalem. But we take a break this weekend from the pressure of Jesus about making a decision now, here in the present, to follow Him. The absolute and total commitment of last weekend is now more of a how-to-do list, an instructional piece to guide them as they go out. This 14th Sunday in Ordinary time we find Jesus appointing seventy two disciples to a very specific mission. He already had 12 apostles, those who were to be the leaders of His new Jerusalem. These 72 were to go out ahead of Him to towns and places where He would be visiting. Note that they were evangelizing before He got there. Evangelizing meant they were preparing His way, announcing His Good News, getting things ready for Him to approach. They are very reminiscent of the 72 helpers Moses received from God to help Moses care for His people during the Exodus.

Of course, they go forth to follow His directions, and most likely much to their surprise, they are quite effective. So they return rejoicing, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Just a bit full of themselves perhaps, but really more of a surprise that it worked at all. They even drove out demons! Jesus reminds them that He is the One who gave them the power to do that. It must also have served them well to do and accomplish this...to build up their confidence that they could help Him...there was something more they could accomplish for the mission...if they would allow Him to use them, His power, His grace.

Well, one not need to be a rocket scientist to figure this out, my fellow disciples. We are the 72...we are apostles, ones sent out...we are disciples sent out on mission to prepare His way into the hearts of our brothers and sisters. We can have full confidence that He will fill in the blanks that we cannot fill in, He will provide what we are lacking, He just wants to use our hands and feet, our mouths to speak, our hearts to love...He will do the rest, He will see that there are those who can finish what we start. And if we do our part, evangelizing for Him, we can rejoice, for He will write our names in heaven. Pretty good reward, is it not? St Joseph, pray for our confidence to follow your Jesus...and even precede Him.

### Ordinary Time

#### Question:

Why do we have a liturgical season called ordinary time? Can you explain?

#### Answer:

Ordinary time is the longest season of the liturgical year. It begins the Monday after January 6, the Epiphany, and goes until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. That period can last anywhere from five to eight weeks, depending on when Easter is celebrated. Ordinary time picks up again the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and lasts from twenty-three to twenty-seven weeks, until the end of the liturgical year, the Saturday before Advent begins.

Why the name ordinary? "Ordinary" is not in contrast to "extraordinary" or "special" but rather stresses the Latin language notion of "ordinal" or numbered Sundays. The Latin title for the season, *tempus ordinarium*, conveys the sense that this time of the year is measured or numbered time. Measured time can allude simply to the numbered Sundays, or the notion that these Sundays are a "measured" time to deepen and immerse ourselves completely in the realities of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. Ordinary time offers us the opportunity to connect the ordinary lived experiences of our lives with those of Jesus, who modeled for us how to live a truly human existence.
