Oh, He is back to teaching us, challenging us to be more like Him and His Father, of whom He is From the the fullness of Revelation. So a scholar of the Law...think a really gifted scribe/Pharisee...wants to Paster know how to get to heaven. Jesus asks him to say what is in the Law of Moses. Instead of quoting

613 laws, the scholar wisely sums up two Old Testament passages (Dt 6:5 and Lev 19:18) and says love God and love neighbor as self. The scholar himself said this because it was already in use as a tradition of Jewish moral and legal thought.

Then the mistake on the part of the scholar...and the cause of teaching on the part of Jesus. The gospel says, "But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Think...help me to rationalize this, Jesus. Help me to be able to say whoever I want to be my neighbor. Jesus tells a story...a man was beat up very badly, left for dead most likely...a priest on duty and a Levite, both worried about ritual purity, pass by...lo and behold, a Samaritan, a half breed Jewish/Gentile, a heretic and schismatic, passes by...a Samaritan, "was moved with compassion by the sight." He goes overboard in his care of the wounded man. Then Jesus drops the bomb..."Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robber's victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." And Jesus said to him (and to us), "Go and do likewise."

So, Jesus put a Samaritan in the role of a good example to this scholar scribe in His story...someone the scribe would least expect and want to be showing compassion to the victim. Who would I most not want to see in his place if I were the scribe? A black, a brown, a yellow, a white...how about a Democrat or a Republican...someone I dislike or someone who hurt me...someone I disagree with or who disagrees with me...some Catholic who doesn't measure up to my standard of Catholic. Would I stop to help? Would I treat her/him with mercy? Or, disciple, would I do the rationalizing game...and just pass by. "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Pray about it...what needs to change in me? Our soul's eternal life depends on our answer. Who is my neighbor? St Joseph, pray for us. Fr. Jim

## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

What Jesus Doesn't Say

"If Jesus wanted us to (fill in the blank), he would have said so."

We hear this argument applied to every controversial topic under the sun — and even some not-so-controversial topics, too. Whenever someone is trying to make a case for a decision they have already made, they call in Jesus' scriptural silence on the matter as their expert, unimpeachable witness.

And sure, there's much Jesus doesn't talk about in the Gospels. But by this logic, we would have to assume that Jesus doesn't care, for instance, if we drive well over the speed limit (he doesn't discuss cars and highways in the Bible) or what we do online (he never mentions the Internet or websites at all!), when we know that certainly is just not the case.

Like the scholar of the Jewish law who challenges Jesus to define who exactly his "neighbor" is, we can argue semantics all we want. But if we rest in prayer and look deep into our hearts, we know what path we need to take, and it's usually not the easy one.

I find that I do this plenty in ways that are far more subtle. I lament that the situation facing me is not sufficiently "black and white." I become frustrated by the shades of moral grey and toss up my hands, claiming I don't know what the right answer is, insisting that I can't be blamed for the ramifications of whatever decision I make.

What I need to be doing in these situations is asking God for His guidance, even if it makes me nervous. I need to be like the scholar. He was brave enough to ask, even though I think he knew he wouldn't particularly like the answer. Let's strive for that same courage.
