If you thought last week's diatribe about "take care to guard against all greed" was a tough one to follow, grab hold of yourself, because the ride is not over and the bumps will get tougher. This 19th Sunday in Ordinary time Jesus continues to expound about the kingdom of His Father. "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom." Sell your belongings, give alms. "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." You must live prepared, "for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Has He lost His mind? Is He really serious? Maybe He had a heat stroke, gets quite warm there at times! Peter may be right when he asks Jesus, "Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" Is this for us, who have been walking with You for some time, or really for everyone, all disciples? And there follows all that stuff about what degree of beating people will get! Beating? Yes...servants at this time and era often were treated like animals, pieces of property. (Don't choke on this...the early history of our beloved country is filled with stories of indentured white people and black slaves sometimes being horribly beaten...some of us take a long time to get on board with Jesus and His Father's kingdom!).

Go back to the beginning of the gospel for today...how did it start? "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom." Do not be afraid to get your heart and mind where they need to be. Do not be afraid! Following Jesus may demand hard things, difficult changes in thought and attitude, making painful choices that are of God, not the world or culture we live in. Yes, and those of us who have more gifts, even more will be required of us. Do not live by fear...live by faith. Check out the second reading for today...Abraham, our father in faith, lived by faith in God, made tough choices, tough decisions. So did our own St Joseph. And Mary His mother. Hmmm? Suppose they were on to something here? Faith, not fear.

St Joseph, we need your prayers.

EUCHARISTIC SAINT FOR AUGUST - ST. ALPHONSUS LIGOURI

St. Alphonsus was a bishop, doctor of the church, and the founder of the Redemptorist Congregation. In celebrating Mass, his face was radiant with joy. After the Consecration, he would blush from the intensity of his emotion. He writes, "My most courteous Lord, when you enter my soul in Holy Communion, you unite with and give yourself to me, so that in all truth I can say: My Jesus, now you are all mine." Regarding Eucharistic adoration, he says, "Pause for a while each day before Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Know that the time you spend in devotion before this most divine Sacrament will be the most fruitful in your life; it will comfort you when you die and in eternity. Give your whole self to the Lord who has given all things to you! Approach the Blessed Sacrament "as the burning bush" in order to catch fire and set others ablaze. St. Alphonsus died in 1787 at the age of 91. His feast day is Aug. 1.

EUCHARISTIC REFLECTION FOR AUGUST - THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS

Without supernatural grace, due to the original sin of Adam and Eve and our own sins, we are profoundly alienated from God. However, for love of each one of us, Christ freely offered His life on the cross to restore us to Himself, that we may become children of God. On the cross, He is both the priest offering a sacrifice to the Father and the victim being offered. The Eucharist makes present to us the one sacrifice of Christ by which we are reconciled to the Father. In the Mass, we are drawn into Jesus' perfect offering of love, so that we may offer ourselves together with Him to the Father.
