Dear Friends

Happy Labor Day everyone!

This weekend is always a bit bittersweet for me because it marks the unofficial end of summer. This summer has gone by in a blink with all the transitions but it has been a good one. Of course, the upside is Packer football returns, the kids are back in school, and we get a reprieve from some of the intense heat and humidity.

As the seasons change I find myself more reflective, especially spiritually. I find it a natural time to think back on the previous few months and see where God has led me through all that has happened. Life is so fast paced it's often difficult to understand what God is doing in the moment. That's why intentional periods of reflection are good for one's heart and one's soul. Perhaps you may join me in this reflection, in thinking about the joy and adventures of the summer months and, for those returning to school, what joys and graces you seek in the new year. To all the students, faculty, and staff resuming the school year, both here at St. Mary and elsewhere, know of my prayers and well-wishes for a wonderful year. Having settled in to the parish, I'm very excited to get to know our students, parents, and teachers. I'm especially looking forward to visiting the classrooms. Switching gears, a bit, I want to reflect briefly on the meaning of work as we celebrate Labor Day. Labor Day is a secular holiday, but the Church has taught, especially in modern times, the importance of work, the dignity of the worker, and care for God's creation. As believers, this is a day to stop and reflect on the many hands that help put food on our tables, provide for the clothes we wear, the houses we live in, and all the many comforts of life. Work is dignified because of the work of the Creator. In 1981, St. John Paul II wrote an encyclical called *Laborem Exercens*, meaning *On Human Work*, and said the following, "Work is, as has been said, an obligation, that is to say, a duty, on the part of man. ...Man must work, both because the Creator has commanded it and because of his own humanity, which requires work in order to be maintained and developed. Man must work out of regard for others, especially his own family, but also for the society he belongs to, the country of which he is a child, and the whole human family of which he is a member, since he is the heir to the work of generations and at the same time a sharer in building the future of those who will come after him in the succession of history."

I leave you with that quote to ponder as I hope you all have a wonderful and relaxing holiday weekend.

Fatima Statue to Visit

Holy Apostles Catholic Parish in New Berlin

In Fatima, Portugal in 1917, Our Lady enlisted three shepherd children as messengers to implore people to turn away from sin and save the world from Divine justice. The Miracle of the Sun was witnessed by 70,000 people in October, 1917 to validate this message. The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Fatima was commissioned in 1947 by the last survivor of the three children seers to spread this message. The statue was blessed by Pope Pius XII in 1947, and is the most travelled statue in the world, bringing the message of peace from Our Lady to share with the world.

The statue is touring the Milwaukee Archdiocese in September, and all are invited to tour-related events. On September 17, the statue will visit Holy Apostles for the following:

8:30 am: Procession of the statue and introduction by statue custodian

9:00 am: Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

10:00 am - 2:45 pm: Holy Rosary, Prayer, Veneration


2:45 - 3:00 pm: Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

3:00 - 4:30 pm: Veneration

Have Bread, Will Deliver

For the past twenty years, Skip and Ginger Rambo have been in the bread pick-up and delivery business. It's not a for-profit business by any means but their personal stewardship project to pick up unsold bread from two retailers and deliver it to food pantries in the area.



Skip got the idea one day when he was at *Breadsmith* on South 76th Street picking up bread for a soup meal that was being served at St. Mary. He asked the counter person what they did with bread that was unsold at the end of the day. He was told that some organizations picked it up and redistributed it to those in need. But often, it went into the dumpster.

That sparked an idea that eventually turned into a twenty-year weekly commitment for the Rambos. "We saw this as our way of using our talents. It is stewardship plain and simple," Skip said. "It is our way to pay back for the many gifts we have received from God. This high-quality bread is so important to the people who visit these pantries to get food for themselves and their families."

Over these past two decades, Skip has picked up bread from *Panera* on Friday and Saturday evenings and from *Breadsmith* on Tuesdays. This means three trips a week to pick up bread and two trips to deliver it to the food pantries.

He takes the large bags of breads, bagels, and pastries home where he and Ginger re-package the items into smaller quantities. Those smaller bags of breads are then delivered to three area food pantries - Northcott Neighborhood House, Repairers of the Breach, both in Milwaukee, and Muskego Food Pantry - on Mondays and Wednesdays.

The job is quite simple but requires a firm commitment on the part of volunteers/ministers week in and week out, Skip noted. *Panera* and *Breadsmith* have specific times when they want someone to pick up the bread.

Skip said that the relationships he has developed over the years not only with the staffs at the bakeries, but also at the food pantries, has been reward enough for his work. "All of these people are wonderful," he said.

The Rambos have done this job primarily by themselves, but have had family help on occasion. Skip noted that the tasks could certainly be shared by two or more couples or two or more individuals.

Beyond their personal time of about eight to ten hours a week to do this ministry from pick-up to delivery, Skip estimates that he drives about 1,700 miles a year. That driving is done in all kinds of weather and conditions. There is always someone at the pantries who help Skip unload the bags of bread.

Soon to be 85 years old, Skip said the time has come to pass this well-baked ministry on to someone else. "I am praying that this touches someone else's heart," Ginger said. Both Rambos have gotten so much more in return for the time they have spent in this ministry than they could have imagined.


