## Dear Friends

*Praised be Jesus Christ!*

I find myself rather thankful this week. Last weekend was a busy one for us with many wonderful celebrations taking place. On Saturday morning we hosted the Archdiocesan Jubilee Mass which celebrates couples throughout the archdiocese who are celebrating a milestone anniversary this year. We had over 150 people here with couples celebrating as many as sixty-four years of marriage. How incredible. His Excellency, Bishop Jeffery Haines was the celebrant with Deacon Bill assisting and me concelebrating.

On Sunday, Bishop Haines returned for the 11:00 am Mass to confirm fifty-three of our young people. That too, was a beautiful Mass in which you could palpably sense the Holy Spirit. As Bishop Haines said, these young people are the reason for our hope and excitement for the future. While some may be frustrated that something “extra” is happening during Mass, I challenge us to see the beauty and grace of those “extras”. The word “catholic” means universal, we are a faith community, and so for the community to gather around each other for these sacramental moments is really wonderful. I must say, it was pretty awesome to see the church full!

I reference last weekend to once again highlight the wonderful things happening in our parish and to hopefully call to our minds the power of the Holy Spirit. I also want to acknowledge all the hard work it takes for these liturgies to be so beautiful. From parish staff, sacristans, catechists, acolytes, cantors, hospitality ministers, and many others it is a communal effort. I thank you all for your ministry and your dedication. Whether your work is public or behind the scenes, always know it is valued and appreciated.

A couple of more thank yous to give. We know well the tremendous support that our sister parish in Haiti, Our Lady of Perpetual Help, has received since the devastating earthquake. Countless people have given their wealth and their prayers to our family in Haiti. As I mentioned a few weeks ago, St. Dominic Parish (my former assignment) took up a second collection to help our sister parish. They have incredibly raised \$21,000 for our sister parish. Wow! I am so grateful for their generosity. While I'm amazed at such a total, I am not surprised, because the good people of St. Dominic Parish have always been so generous.

Finally, the Knights of Columbus Holy Spirit Council 4648 generously raised \$1,000 for Haiti as well through a pancake breakfast a couple of weeks ago. The goodness of the Church is on full display when we see the efforts made by so many to put together opportunities to help each other and then to see the generosity that comes from those events. My brother Knights, thank you!

While Thanksgiving is still a few weeks away I encourage us to offer some prayers of gratitude this week for the goodness of the others and the power of the Holy Spirit.

## **Advance Medical Directives: Planning for Your Future**

Human life is good and to be protected. All medical decisions ought to reflect this core belief. Yet some medical and legal documents used to define a patient's future care can be harmful. No matter how well-crafted, they can't predict all the possible scenarios and best courses of action. In each set of circumstances, we need to judge whether a given treatment will provide real benefit to the patient, without causing harm or disproportionate burdens. The safest option is to designate a health care agent to make decisions if you become incapable of doing so. It's best to appoint a responsible, trustworthy person who understands and shares your Catholic values, and can apply them when the need arises.

## **Top Reasons to Oppose Assisted Suicide**

Some polls indicate that the public is receptive to assisted suicide. But the same polls show that people's views shift when they learn about its dangers - especially the dangers for those who are poor, elderly, disabled, or without access to good medical care. Consider that, in Oregon and California, some patients' health insurance offered to pay for assisted suicide, but not treatment. And in states where assisted suicide is legal, often no psychiatric evaluation or treatment is required. Additionally, assisted suicide fosters discrimination by creating two classes of people: those whose suicides we spend millions of dollars to prevent and those whose suicides we assist and treat as a positive good.
