

From Fr. Aaron's Desk

As we light the fourth and final candle of our Advent Wreaths this week we are called to reflect on peace. We already can hear the message of the angels, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will". Our world longs for peace perhaps now more than ever. There's so much unrest not only between nations but in people homes and families. I've heard stories of families that are now divided due to politics and aspects of the pandemic. Those are always difficult situations. To reflect on peace on these final days before Christmas is providential because the question I keep coming back to is, "How do I want to receive Jesus?" The birth of the Messiah is a gift of immeasurable grace. We welcome Christ into our hearts and home once more, but how? How do we welcome Him? For me, my answer is peacefully. I hope to be peaceful come Christmas morning. We all have many stressors right now between family plans, dinners, gifts, and events. We might stress about tensions between certain members of our family. It could be anything. My prayer is that I can hand over the things that cause me unrest to God so that I can peacefully receive His Son. One way to do this might be to write an intention in the red binder near the baptistry in the back of church. Perhaps you have your own prayer journal where you can write down what weighs heavy. Maybe coming to confession will be that act of surrender. Often times doing something concrete like that can help us give our burdens to God. While I pray for my own peace, be assured that I pray for yours.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
Where there is hatred, let me sow love.
Where there is injury, pardon.
Where there is doubt, faith.
Where there is despair, hope.
Where there is darkness, light.
And where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master,
grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console;
to be understood as to understand;
to be loved as to love.
For it is in giving that we receive,
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

(adapted from Jack Jezreel of JustFaith Ministries)

Hope is best done in community. "The religious imagination is best exercised by 'we'. Because Christian hope is only about 'we'. 'Me and God' doesn't get it. If being a church community means anything, it must mean that we imagine together a new possibility. The minute we stop dreaming, stop imagining together is the day we stop growing and start becoming ever so predictable and stagnant. In addition, we hope together because hope is sometimes difficult and on our own and not always possible for some. And so we hope on each other's behalf, to keep hope active, to enable hope in each other. We need the dreamers, the visionaries, the holy ones, the elders, the peacemakers among us to sustain us when we lose heart.

"In conclusion, could it be that the best we can do in the coming days of Advent is to set aside time to dream, to imagine what God is up to, and to imagine what our lives together might become? Then, the practice of hope becomes our prayer. Imagination becomes an act of holiness. And our dreams shared allow for a new creation. Imagine."




