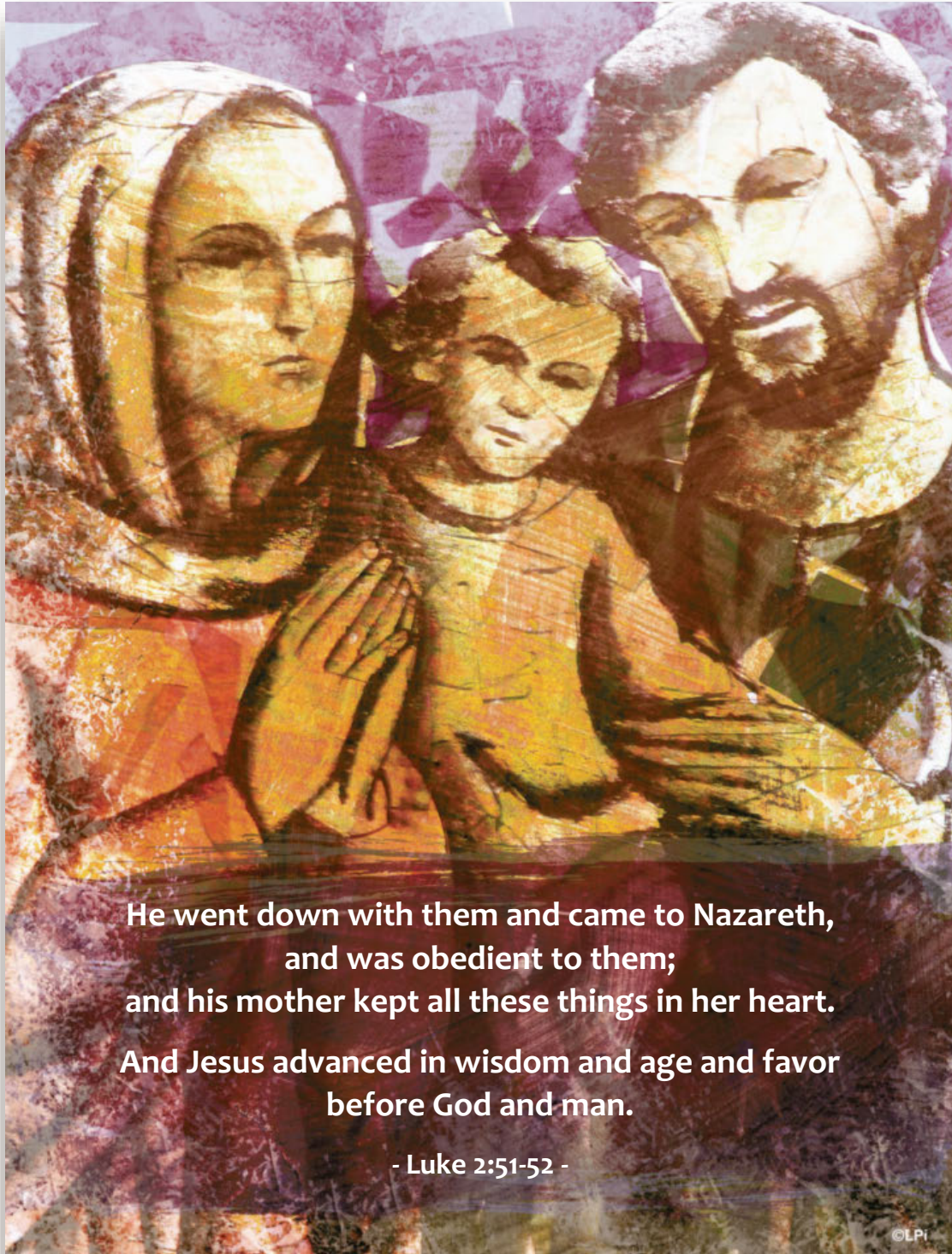

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I hope everyone is enjoying and celebrating the birth of our Savior! I feel so blessed to celebrate Christmas in my new home, St. Mary Parish. Everything has been so beautiful from the spirit of prayer, to the music, to the decorations, and everything in between. If you are a guest to our parish, please know that you are always welcome and we are happy to pray with you!

Our attention now turns to the Holy Family. Having celebrated Jesus' birth, we look to Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as the model for family life. What we learn from the Holy Family is that they were very faithful. They adhered to all the practices of their faith, and know that both Joseph and Mary had intimate personal relationships with God. That doesn't mean their life was perfect. They too experienced stress, heartache, worry, and perhaps even confusion. Any parent who has lost a child in the grocery store knows that horrible feeling of not knowing where your child is. What Joseph and Mary must have felt when they couldn't find Jesus, only to learn he was teaching in the Temple. We look to the Holy Family not as model of perfection that is unattainable, but rather as an example of holiness and fidelity to God which bolstered their fidelity to one another. Joseph, for instance, was not the father he was for his own sake or by his own power. He fulfilled that role with joy because that is what God asked of him. It was God's grace that allowed him to be the faithful protector of the Holy Family.

Each home is a domestic church and the primary place of formation for children. For the Holy Family, their home was where God dwelled - literally. So too, our homes are meant to be dwelling places of God where all members of a family grow together in holiness and children learn the ways of faith. When I meet with a family to plan the funeral for their mom or dad, so often do family members tell me about how their parents taught them about God. They can recall stories of praying the rosary as a family, always making sure to come to Mass as a family, and being taught to always seek the good. Those memories are vivid and their lives were formed well because of their parents.

In the words of our Holy Father Pope Francis, "Let us fervently call upon Mary Most Holy, the Mother of Jesus and our Mother, and St. Joseph her spouse. Let us ask them to enlighten, comfort and guide every family in the world, so that they may fulfil with dignity and peace the mission which God has entrusted to them."

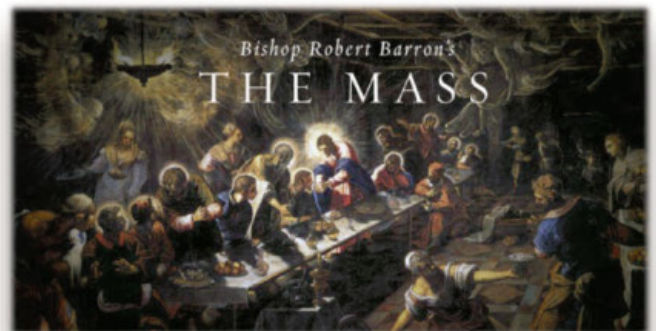

Parish Membership

New-to-the-area families and individuals are welcome and invited to join St. Mary Catholic Faith Community. Young adults should join as members on their own. You may register online by emailing the Parish Office or in person at the Parish Office during our regular office hours. Registration is required for Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Eucharist Preparation, Confirmation, Marriage, and enrollment in Catholic Formation (religious education) programs.

Infant Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated generally on the second and fourth Sundays of the month at 1:00 and 2:00 pm (four families per time slot). Please contact the Parish Office during the first trimester. Baptism preparation work is required for parents.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament of Matrimony may be celebrated most Fridays and Saturdays of the year, with the exception of the Seasons of Advent and Lent. The bride or the groom or both must be registered as members of the parish and are expected to be attending Mass regularly. Weddings must be scheduled at least nine months before the actual wedding date. For more details or to schedule a wedding, please contact the pastor.

Pastoral Care Ministry

If you are going to have surgery or if you suddenly take ill and would like a priest to anoint you, please call the Parish Office and let the administrative assistants know you would like the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Also, Pastoral Care ministers can call and pray with you if you are ill or as you recover; again, please call the Parish Office staff to set up a connection with a Pastoral Care minister.

St. Vincent de Paul Outreach

St. Mary St. Vincent de Paul Society is available to serve those who need food or other resources. If you need assistance, call the Parish Office at 414-425-2174 and at the voice prompt, enter extension 310. A St. Vincent de Paul representative will call you back to discuss your needs.
