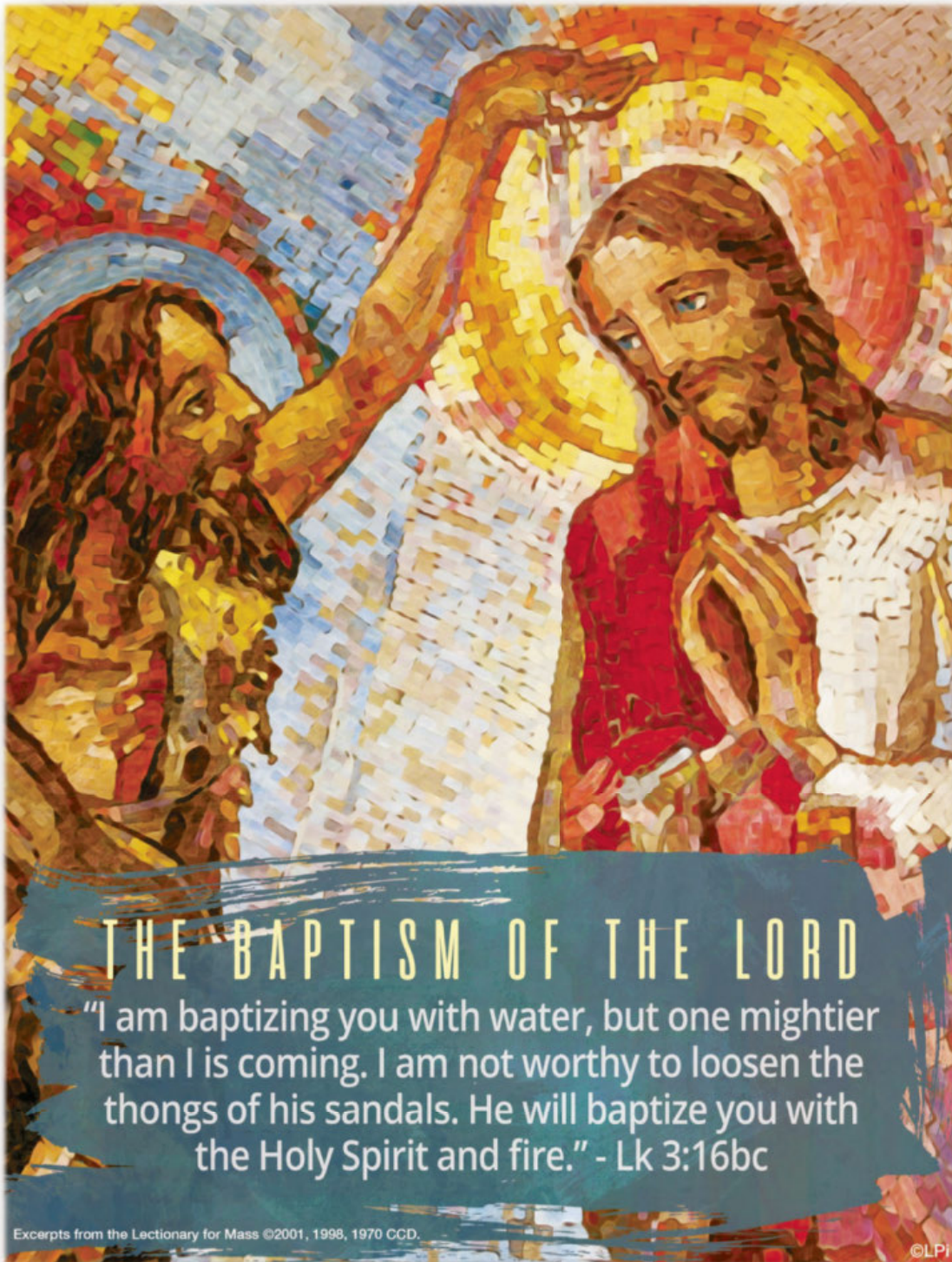

January 9, 2022 • The Baptism of the Lord

Dear Friends

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I have a question for you...do you know the date of your baptism? My baptism took place on October 9, 1990 at St. Helen Church. I was baptized by pastor Fr. Albin Sowinski, whose chalice was gifted to me and is the one I use whenever I celebrate Mass. As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord this weekend it is the perfect time to spend some time in prayer thinking about our own baptism. Hopefully we find ourselves grateful to our parents for instilling the importance of faith in our lives. We might think of our Godparents who helped form us in the faith. If you were baptized later in life, perhaps you are reflecting on what "God-winks" led you to want to be baptized. Baptisms are always a great joy for priests and deacons because there is such a sense of hope and excitement at what lies ahead for the child. So, if you don't know the date of your baptism I would encourage you to find your certificate or look at pictures if you have them. If you still have trouble, you can always call the parish of your baptism or the archdiocese.

In one of my seminary classes I remember talking about why Jesus was baptized. It was interesting, because what we believe about baptism - being welcomed into God's family, having an indelible mark left on our soul, the washing away of Original Sin - Jesus did not need any of that. So, why be baptized? Plus, wouldn't it make more sense for Jesus, the Son of God, to baptize John? Well, it is true Jesus didn't "need" to be baptized but he *chose* to be baptized for a couple of reasons. First, by Jesus entering the waters of baptism he sanctified those waters in a new awesome way. Through his baptism he opened the doors, if you will, for all people to follow. By Jesus entering into those waters, entering into the ritual, it became holy and grace-filled in a whole new way. So, in that sense, Jesus is giving a great gift through his baptism. Secondly, he set an example for us. Throughout Jesus' life he did and said things that are examples for us to follow, like the washing of the feet. Now, by being baptized, it is call for all people to do just as Jesus did.

Every time when we enter church and bless ourselves with Holy Water we are recalling our baptism. We are marking ourselves with the sign of our faith. The next time you bless yourself I encourage you to be a bit more intentional. Maybe pause for a second. Try to realize the importance of that water and the sign of cross with which you mark yourself. Jesus' baptism is a great gift to all of us because we are now the adopted sons and daughters of God.

St. Mary Parish invites you to join our video streaming team that has been faithfully presenting Sunday Masses online to all those in our community who have been unable to attend in person. Starting in February, we will produce online weekend Mass in a new way. We are seeking videographers, filmmakers, photographers, and technicians (amateur or professional) to video-record and upload our Saturday 4:00 pm Masses. A good eye, good reflexes, a little spontaneity for anything that might occur technically, and comfort with computers are needed. Specifically you will be shown how to video-record Mass using a single video camera and upload the recording to a streaming site that homebound participants can then access. Support will be provided by our parish technology staff. This is an excellent opportunity for individuals *and* families to serve the parish, and along the way, learn the elements of Catholic liturgy (Order of Worship), and of course, participate in the Mass!

"The Chosen"

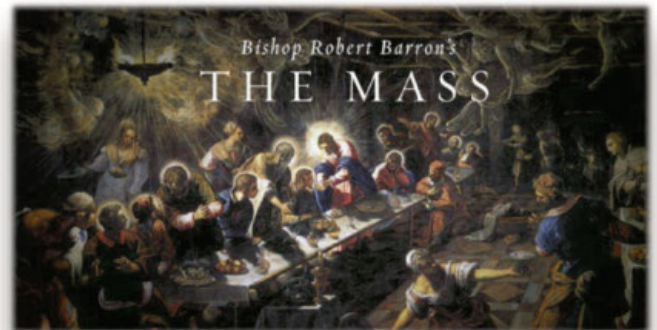
Wednesday Evenings,

Respect Life - January, 2022

Saturday January 22, (the anniversary of Roe v. Wade) is the day the U.S. Bishops set aside for a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. It is also a day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. We are each called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, and/or giving alms.

The act of abortion rejects God's gift of life. Abortion destroys the life of a child, lovingly knit together in his or her mother's womb, and for someone who has participated in abortion, the loss of a child can form a hole in their heart so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the emptiness. As a human and Christian family, we grieve the loss of so many lives. And yet, even in our grief, we know there is hope.

Christ came for the very purpose of redeeming our sins, offering us his forgiveness, and giving us his peace. Jesus comes to free us from the bonds of sin. And there is no sin that is beyond God's mercy. It is never too late to seek the Lord's mercy and healing through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. His greatest desire is to forgive us, pouring out His infinite mercy upon us so that we may be healed. If you or someone you know is suffering after abortion, confidential, compassionate help is available. We are all sinners. But with the grace of God, we can become saints. We can be lights to the nations, sharing the truth about the irrevocable dignity of the human person. Parish Membership

New-to-the-area families and individuals are welcome and invited to join St. Mary Catholic Faith Community. Young adults should join as members on their own. You may register online by emailing the Parish Office or in person at the Parish Office during our regular office hours. Registration is required for Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Eucharist Preparation, Confirmation, Marriage, and enrollment in Catholic Formation (religious education) programs.

Infant Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated generally on the second and fourth weekends of the month during the liturgies, and on the third Sunday of the month at 1:00 pm. Please contact the Parish Office during the first trimester. Baptism preparation work is required for parents.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament of Matrimony may be celebrated most Fridays and Saturdays of the year, with the exception of the Seasons of Advent and Lent. The bride or the groom or both must be registered as members of the parish and are expected to be attending Mass regularly. Weddings must be scheduled at least nine months before the actual wedding date. For more details or to schedule a wedding, please contact the pastor.

Pastoral Care Ministry

If you are going to have surgery or if you suddenly take ill and would like a priest to anoint you, please call the Parish Office and let the administrative assistants know you would like the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Also, Pastoral Care ministers can call and pray with you if you are ill or as you recover; again, please call the Parish Office staff to set up a connection with a Pastoral Care minister.

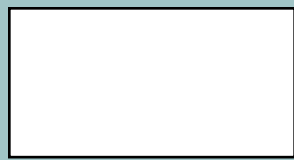
