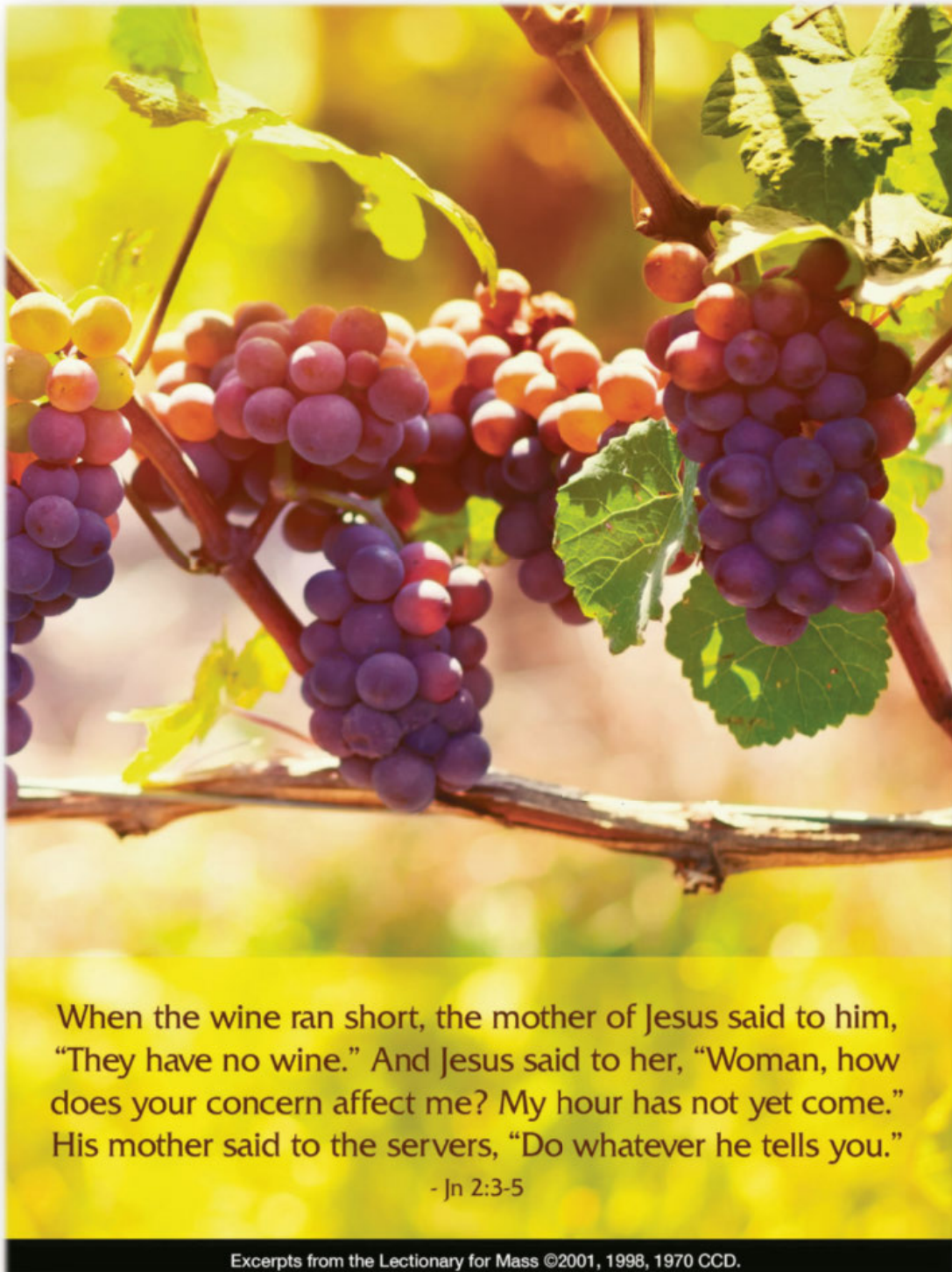

January 16, 2022 • Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends

Praised be Jesus Christ!

We have returned to Ordinary Time and with that I, once again, can wear my favorite color - Green! ... Of course, with a touch of gold as well. Ordinary Time is not ordinary in the sense that it is common, but rather comes from the word "ordinal" or numbered. The weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered and that's how the term came to be. The invitation of Ordinary Time is to reflect on the ordered life of the Church - this period of time where we are neither feasting nor fasting. It is a chance to reflect on the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time, and the constant coming of Jesus into our everyday lives.

Saint Paul is writing to the Corinthians this week and the portion of the letter we hear proclaimed is some of his most beautiful writing. I have often used the imagery of a mosaic or a tapestry when talking about how it takes all of God's people to build the Kingdom of Heaven. Just think of a mosaic; many pieces of tile comprise the mosaic. They are of different sizes and colors. From far you might not even be able to distinguish the individual tiles. Yet, if even one of those were missing, the image wouldn't be complete, it wouldn't be as beautiful as intended. Think of a tapestry. It is the weaving of many colored threads that make for a beautiful image. So too for the Church. It takes the God-given gifts of all of us to minister and build the Kingdom of Heaven. Saint Paul reminds us that all of us have been given various gifts. They come from the same Spirit for the same purpose, but different for each of us. This is the beauty of the Church! Nobody's gifts are more important than any one else's, because those are gifts given to us from God to live a holy life. When you look at the life of our parish, we have so many people that come from different backgrounds with varied experiences in different stages of life. Yet, the goal is the same - to be a saint! As I continue to learn more about all of you and build relationships, I become more and more grateful for the many gifts present here in our parish.

I hope to see you for a series on the Mass beginning on Tuesday, January 25, and for a viewing of the TV series, *The Chosen* on Wednesday nights in the Gathering Space. These offerings are sure to be prayerful, fun, and beautiful evenings.

Video Ministry Service Opportunity

Bring the Mass to Our Homebound Faith Community!

St. Mary Parish invites you to join our video streaming team that has been faithfully presenting Sunday Masses online to all those in our community who have been unable to attend in person. Starting in February, we will produce online weekend Mass in a new way. We are seeking videographers, filmmakers, photographers, and technicians (amateur or professional) to video-record and upload our Saturday 4:00 pm Masses. A good eye, good reflexes, a little spontaneity for anything that might occur technically, and comfort with computers are needed. Specifically you will be shown how to video-record Mass using a single video camera and upload the recording to a streaming site that homebound participants can then access. Support will be provided by our parish technology staff. This is an excellent opportunity for individuals *and* families to serve the parish, and along the way, learn the elements of Catholic liturgy (Order of Worship), and of course, participate in the Mass!

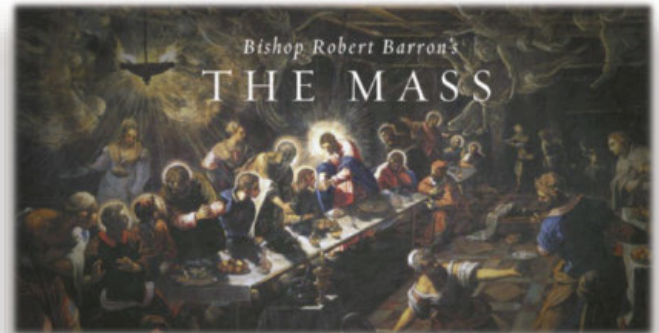
“The Chosen”

Respect Life - January, 2022

Saturday January 22, (the anniversary of Roe v. Wade) is the day the U.S. Bishops set aside for a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. It is also a day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. We are each called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, and/or giving alms.

The act of abortion rejects God's gift of life. Abortion destroys the life of a child, lovingly knit together in his or her mother's womb, and for someone who has participated in abortion, the loss of a child can form a hole in their heart so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the emptiness. As a human and Christian family, we grieve the loss of so many lives. And yet, even in our grief, we know there is hope.

Christ came for the very purpose of redeeming our sins, offering us his forgiveness, and giving us his peace. Jesus comes to free us from the bonds of sin. And there is no sin that is beyond God's mercy. It is never too late to seek the Lord's mercy and healing through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. His greatest desire is to forgive us, pouring out His infinite mercy upon us so that we may be healed. If you or someone you know is suffering after abortion, confidential, compassionate help is available. We are all sinners. But with the grace of God, we can become saints. We can be lights to the nations, sharing the truth about the irrevocable dignity of the human person. Where sin abounds, God's grace abounds all the more. Therefore, let us take courage and offer prayer and penance, that all human life would be welcomed in love and protected in law.

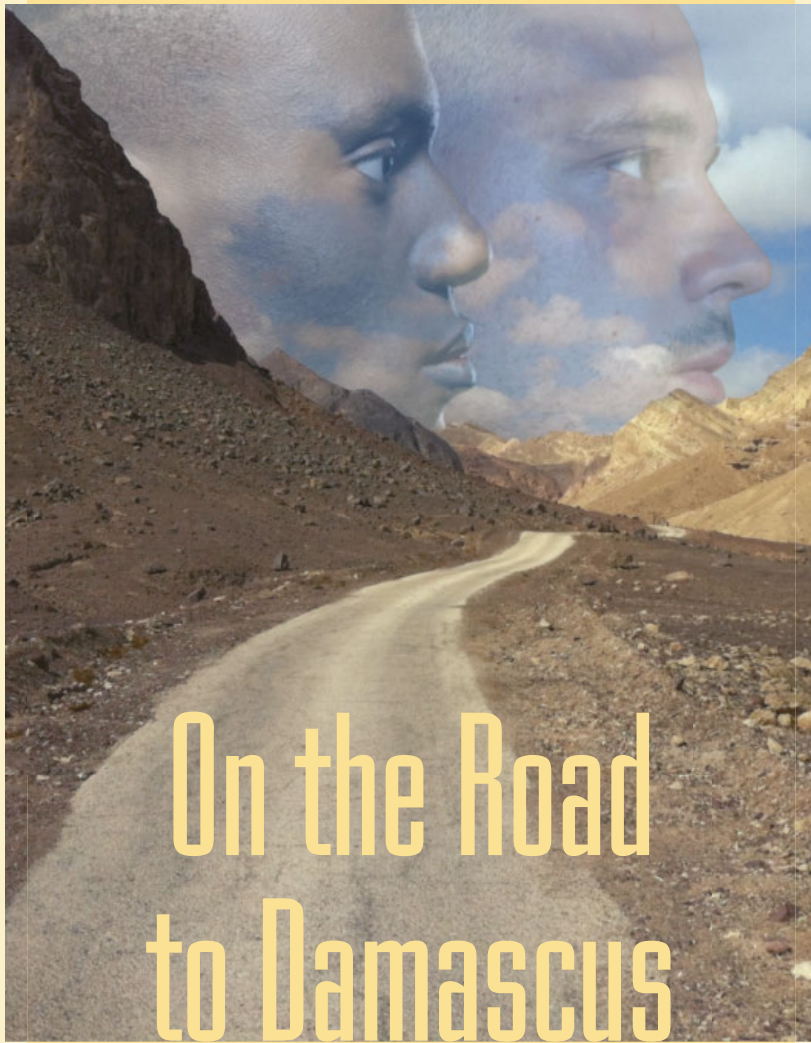
