From Our Pastor



On this first Sunday of Lent, the Gospel speaks to us of the forty days Jesus spent in the desert, summing up in His own Person the forty years the people of Israel spent in the wilderness moving from slavery to the Promised Land. The forty days of Christ's testing also provide the form for our own facing of temptation through the spiritual nourishment of prayer.

Lent is the time for conversion of life and more passionately committed following of the Lord. Our own personal investment in growing in spiritual health is the most immediate, practical response we can give the Lord, for the good of the Church and the life of the world.

Using our calendars as instruments of prayer, today would be the ideal moment to map out how we are going to prioritize the things of God in the weeks ahead. This weekend's bulletin is filled with opportunities for us to do this with the support of other people.

An optimal Lenten practice of growing in prayer would be committing to a weekly holy hour at our perpetual adoration chapel, the Oratory of St. Mary Magdalene. In this Sunday's Gospel, we see how Jesus seeks out silent intimacy with His Heavenly Father by going to a wilderness place set apart. The Oratory is designed to be like the Garden of Paradise, revealing the gifts of Heaven that the Lord wins for us through Passion, Death, and Resurrection—all to give to us in fresh, new ways this year.

As Christ was faced with three temptations in the wilderness, we must contend with three temptations when it comes to prayer: fear of commitment, fear of not "doing" anything, and fear of intimacy. Scheduling an hour of being with the Eucharistic Lord in the Oratory is a loving act of faith around which we can organize the rest of our life. It is perfectly "useless," because it comes from the gratuity of love, liberating us from having to achieve another thing or indeed anything. Finally, our weekly holy hour exposes us to how Christ wishes us to just be with Him and rest in Him, surrounded by the beauty of silence, the first language God uses to speak to us!

Finally, please keep in your prayers the men giving and receiving the Christ Renews His Parish retreat, as well as the women who will be making their retreat in two weeks.

Just as we believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, we also believe in the necessity of our "real presence" in the Body of Christ gathered as the Church!



Sometimes that grace is the fruit of many moving parts. I saw that this week in two events. Our youth theatre performance, in which grades 2-4 performed some fun, funny, and very inspiring Christian-themed Be the Light songs and scripts, truly did help us to reflect on God's light in our lives. Not only was their actual performance commendable - they had worked hard on this and their quality from rehearsing was truly outstanding - but many others had helped. Teachers had given time from schedules and their presence during rehearsals to make sure all went smoothly. 8th grade volunteers, both young men and young women, helped lead this event, where they would sit on the floor in front of the students and guide them with gestures, reminding them of what to do and when. Our maintenance department put in a huge amount of work getting our gym ready. Our technology staff did likewise, ensuring sound and all mics were working properly and ready to go. Our parents and families helped prepare for and be a part of our evening performance - the gym was packed! Ms. Fowler had help from 5th grade students to make some exceptional artwork for the evening - saint themed - these were incredibly well done! Be the Light was an adaptation from a book by a local children's author, and his family was present to see the show and offer copies for sale. Mrs. Proulx gets particular kudos as her vision and joy really are what made all this possible! So everyone involved in this had their own part to play (we might think of St. Paul's letters explaining we are one body in Christ, each with our own spiritual, different gifts), and the end result was a beautiful testament to the talents of children

That same day, for grades 5-8, we had a vocations assembly, beginning with Mass. Our speakers included Fr. Jay and Ms. Hayes from our own staff, and then St. Vincent's seminarian Caleb Kruse, and two sisters of St. Francis of Perpetual Adoration, from Mishawaka, St. Regina and Sr. Ignatia. Ms. Hayes gets the particular credit here for reaching out to everyone to get this in motion, along with our teachers who helped children pray on this gathering and think of questions they would ask. The Holy Spirit made a particular contribution in that Deacon Brian Isenbarger happened to be home from seminary as well, and had reached out to Fr. Jay, not knowing we were doing this, to see if he could join for Mass and give the homily. He did a great job, and even stayed to take part in the vocations panel. 



EXAMEN PRAYER

The examen prayer is a beautiful practice of prayer popularized by St. Ignatius of Loyola that helps us see the ways that God is moving in our daily lives. Take a few minutes of undistracted quiet in the mid-day or evening for prayer. By regularly reflecting on our day with God's help, we commit ourselves to grow in virtue and in our relationships with God and one another.

Begin by quieting your mind and heart to be more aware of the presence of God, who is always with you. Ask God to give you the grace to see clearly the events of your day through His eyes, to experience the love He unconditionally offers you, and to listen to the guidance He shares with you.

"Give thanks to God our Lord for the benefits received" (St. Ignatius). God loves you, and shows His love through the blessings He gives us. The good things in our life are signs and reminders that God "came so that [we] might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). Our blessings can be big or small: The recovery of a sick loved one; the kind act of a stranger; or the beauty of nature, etc.

- Thinking about your day, what blessings have you received today? What good things have you experienced?
- Bring to mind the many good moments from your day.
- Pause and give thanks to God for these blessings.

ACKNOWLEDGE NEED FOR HELP

"Ask Grace to know our sins and cast them out" (St. Ignatius). Recognizing our blessings, we also acknowledge that we struggle and need help. Often we experience brokenness and pain. Brokenness in the world, brokenness in our relationships, and brokenness within ourselves. That brokenness, which is not a part of God's plan, is a result of those times when we as individuals and we as humanity have chosen to turn away from God's love. Acknowledging this brokenness and need for help can be scary but is an important step in allowing us to move through it, for God wants to create a "clean heart" for us

• Ask God to give you the grace and courage to face this brokenness, both in the world and within yourself, so that you can heal and grow.

REVIEW LIFE HONESTLY

"Ask account of our soul from the hour that we rose up to the present" (St. Ignatius). In conversation with God pray, Lord, "you know me: you know when I sit and stand; you understand my thoughts from afar" (Psalm 139:1-3) and ask God to help you review the events of your day. As you mentally walk through the day, different moments may surface. Honestly examine each of these moments throughout your day. You may remember moments of joy-be grateful for them again. You may find moments where you recognize God's presence only in hindsight-desire to see more clearly. You may realize something good hidden in a difficult situation-trust in God's goodness even during times of struggle. And you may find moments where you turned away from God's love, where you experienced and chose to continue that brokenness-take responsibility for those times and for your role in that. Review your morning, afternoon, and evening.

• As you remember each moment, ask God: Where were you in that moment? What were you asking of me? How did I respond?

Pause to listen to God's response to these questions.

TRUST IN GOD'S FORGIVENESS

"Ask pardon of God our Lord for the faults" (St. Ignatius). As the review of your day reveals times you may have turned away from God's love, let your heart be filled with sorrow and even more of the desire to restore your relationship with God. Like the father of the lost son, God's never-ending love reaches out to welcome us when we turn back toward Him. No matter how you might have turned away, God wants to forgive you. Never let sorrow control you or lead you to doubt the strength of God's love for you, for "neither death, nor life... will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39).

- Ask God to forgive you. Trust that He does forgive you.
- Accept God's mercy.

COMMIT TO LIVE DIFFERENTLY

"To purpose amendment with His grace" (St. Ignatius). Renewed, turn your thoughts to the coming day with the clarity of this prayer experience so that "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you

- What lessons from this prayer can you carry into tomorrow?
- What concrete actions can you take to grow closer to God and others?

• Commit to live these actions, asking for God's help to do so. Close your examen with an Our Father, the prayer that Jesus taught us to say with confidence.

AN EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

Based on the Ten Commandments

I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.

Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any

You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

MAKING YOUR CONFESSION

Greeting: The priest will welcome you; he may say a short blessing or read a Scripture passage.

Sign of the Cross: Together, you and the priest will make the Sign of the Cross. You may then begin your confession with these or similar words: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (give days, months, or years) since my last confession."

<u>Confession</u>: Confess all your sins to the priest. If you are unsure what to say, ask the priest for help. When you are finished, conclude with these or similar words: "I am sorry for these and all my sins."

<u>Penance</u>: The priest will propose an act of penance. The penance might be prayer, a work of mercy, or an act of charity. He might also counsel you on how to better live a

Act of Contrition: Say an Act of Contrition, expressing sorrow for your sins and resolving to leave sin behind and live in the light!

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all of my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell; but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all-good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

<u>Absolution</u>: The priest then blesses you in the person of Christ as he says the prayer of Absolution which frees you from your sins.




