It is an ordinary part of any structure. We rarely look beyond its architectural purpose to appreciate the mystical function it can serve. Liturgists and sacramental theologians recognize the liminal role doors play in church buildings. By 'liminal' the Church is speaking about the intermediary state of the believer, moving from one dimension into another. For

instance, in the case of those being initiated into the Christian faith, the catechumens in ancient times were held at the door of the church because they were not yet fully prepared to

enter in with the assembly for the Eucharist. At the Easter Vigil, the newly baptized had a privileged place in the liturgy's entrance procession, walking across that liminal landscape symbolized by the church doorway.

The entrance door to one's home is also a threshold. It is the portal that takes us from the wideness that is the larger world into the space that is more familiar

and personal – a sanctuary we have fashioned through family and shared memories. The home is the domestic church, the place where the Christian faith is learned and gospel values are practiced in ordinary ways. Entering into this sacred space should be much like entering a church.

To this end, there is a Catholic custom celebrated at the feast of the Epiphany which can remind us of the holiness that is our home. The magi were those visitors from the exotic east who pursued the star and found themselves welcomed into the presence of the Savior. The visit of the magi can be commemorated at our house through the tradition of marking the lintel above the entrance door. With chalk blessed at church, an inscription is written with a series of numbers, letters and crosses. It changes according to the date of the year. This year, it appears as such:

$$20 + C + M + B + 22$$

"20" at the beginning and "22" at the end refer to the year. Because Epiphany comes so near the beginning of the New Year, the numbers represent an annual renewal of God's blessing. The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three kings: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. (Note that some spell the first wise man's name as "Gaspar" or "Kasper," therefore, the first initial may be different than "C.") The letters can also be understood as a Latin abbreviation for the prayer, "Christus mansionem benedicat," or "May Christ bless the house." In between all these, the crosses (not addition signs!) remind us of Jesus to whom we invoke this blessing.

The month of January takes its name from the Roman god Janus who had a face on either side of his head, looking in opposite directions. Janus was the doorkeeper of heaven and patron of the beginning and end of things. This Epiphany blessing situated in January adds a Christian dimension to the notion of looking back on the past and forward to the future, just as a door is a means to going out and coming in. By making the inscription with chalk, a product of clay, we recall the human nature taken by God's eternal Word in this holy season of Christmas.

If this Epiphany custom is not a part of your family, you may want to consider starting a new tradition today when you head home to your front door. Chalk will be blessed at the end of Masses this weekend and blessing prayers with instructions will be provided at the manger scene in church. You are welcome to take with you one of these little kits. And may every person who passes through your door find Christ residing within!



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton January 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering

the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint." Her feast day is celebrated on January 4,


