# Poverty USA is an initiative of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) and was created as an educational resource to help individuals and communities to address poverty in America by confronting the root causes of economic injustice – and promoting policies that help to break the cycle of poverty.

As the domestic anti-poverty program of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the CCHD helps low-income people participate in decisions that affect their lives, families and communities – and nurtures solidarity between people living in poverty and their neighbors.

As Catholic Americans, it is important that we educate ourselves about the objective data regarding poverty in our nation. We should be prompted, not only out of concern for our fellow citizens but also for our brothers and sisters in Christ, to respond to the needs of those who struggle economically each

day and to work toward more equitable systems of access to education, healthcare, employment, nutrition and housing.

The USCCB's website povertyusa.org can be a good starting place to know better the dire circumstances in which too many Americans live. I've selected a few data points worthy of note and share them with you here. I invite you to bring these facts with you to prayer and reflect on how you might respond to the Lord's observation, *"I was hungry and you fed me..."* 

#### **Data from Poverty USA**

In 2018, 38.1 million people or 11.8% of the population of the US lived in poverty. Who lives in poverty? All those who make less than the Federal government's official poverty threshold, which for a family of four is about \$25,700; people working at minimum wage, even holding down multiple jobs; seniors living on fixed incomes; wage earners suddenly out of work; millions of families everywhere from our cities to rural communities.

Poverty does not strike all demographics equally. For example, in 2018, 10.6% of men, and 12.9% of women lived in Poverty USA. Along the same lines, the poverty rate for married couples in 2018 was only 4.7% - but the poverty rate for single-parent families with no wife present was 12.7%, and for single-parent families with no husband present was 24.9%. In 2018, the poverty rate for people living with a disability was 25.7%. That's nearly 4 million people living with a disability – in poverty. That same year 16.2% of all children (11.9 million kids) lived in poverty – that's almost 1 in every 6 children. What's worse, 5.3% of the population – or 17.3 million people – live in deep poverty, with incomes below 50% of their poverty thresholds.

The Department of Agriculture estimated that 11.1% of US households were food insecure in 2018. This means that approximately 14.3 million households had difficulty providing enough food for all their members due to a lack of resources.

The good news: every day, thousands of people, working with their neighbors and community, are finding ways out of poverty by strengthening families, creating jobs and improving neighborhoods. For five decades, CCHD has supported nearly 12,000 community-based projects led by low-income people through their grant programs.

#### A Testimony from an Adorer

When I was asked by one of the organizers of Adoration if I would take a weekly adoration hour, I hesitated to say yes. Why? Because I didn't want to lock in a time commitment since my schedule is so crazy. The more I thought about it, the more I realized the question really came to me from Jesus, not the woman who asked me. She was just His messenger. I chose an hour that generally works in my schedule and share it with another parishioner so we each have someone to fall back on if we can't be there. Usually we both are.

You know when you really love somebody you crave "one-onone" time with them? I've read that how we spend our time is one of the most powerful ways we show our love. I am now addicted to my weekly Adoration hour with Jesus. It's different than prayer at home, different from attending Mass, different from reading the Bible, different from faith sharing in a group. It's just me with Him, me telling Him whatever is on my mind, me telling Him how much I love, adore and need Him. And I'm really working on listening for whatever He has to say. The listening part is a "work in progress" for me, my mind wanders but I bring it back to listen just to Him. There's a special feeling in being in His presence and it can be overwhelming sometimes, but mostly comforting and peaceful.

I leave the Adoration Chapel weekly "filled up" with His love and ready to know, love and serve Him however I can. Please try it, you just might become addicted too! - Mary Raizman

## **FATHER ARCHER'S BOOK COLUMN**

Welcome to my new column! Regularly, I will write up a brief review of recommended book. а The books will span from spiritual reading to novels, philosophy, and psychology. They may also include good children's literature. If you pick one up or have another recommendation. I would love to chat about it!



#### The Lord of the Rings: 'A Light Shines in the Darkness'

I cannot resist suggesting my all-time favorite novel this first week: The Lord of the Rings by JRR Tolkien. While falling in the genera of fantasy, this book contains a wealth of spiritual wisdom and insights into human nature. After first reading this series in 3rd grade, I was hooked as a lifelong fan. As you read, pay attention to the themes of vocation, friendship, and providence - while there are no explicit references to God, there is a strong theme throughout the book that good will triumph so long as one is faithful to one's mission on earth – a message we can never ponder deeply enough.

And the literary merits alone warrant a close read. Tolkien is a master of description. He changes his writing-style to match the setting: long, flowing sentences with the erudite elves; short, choppy sentences in the final throes of the quest in the evil land of Mordor. Some cultural critics have commented that this book prophetically questions the intersection of human freedom and totalitarian governments - a question well worth reflecting upon today.
