COVID Protocols

As of this writing, the St. Louis area is seeing record-climbing numbers in coronavirus cases and hospital admissions. At St. Peter we want to continue our worship and service as best we can and as responsible we can. And our fulltime and PSR schools use the professional guidance of our COVID Task Force to establish policies that help keep in-person learning going for our children. 2021: A "Red Year"

Last year St. Peter parishioners stepped up in great numbers to donate blood. Beyond regular whole blood donations, many parishioners went out of their way to give plasma. We had a grand total of **186 successful donations** which made a difference in the lives of 686 St. Louis area hospital patients dealing with cancer and sickle cell disease, as well as newborn babies, accident

victims and more. I am grateful to **Charles Lucier** for organizing the blood drives at St. Peter. And to all those who supported this life-saving ministry, thank you! The next blood drive at our parish will be on Sunday, February 6.



GENEROUSITY OF PSR COMMUNITY HELPS FAMILIES IN NEED



Our Parish School of Religion program participates in an amazing service project Susan Lueker each December - 100 Neediest Cases.

PSR Principal

We adopt several families who are in desperate situations and our students and their families help to provide not just presents, but true assistance in their need.

We can thank one of our catechists, Gina Jensen, for starting this long-standing tradition. It started small, just her class, adopting one family. Then each year, little by little, more catechists joined with her until now our entire program takes a special night to give of the gifts God has given them. Parents and children shop for gifts, household supplies, bedding, toiletries and give monetary donations to assist with utility bills and housing expenses.

The generosity doesn't stop! This year our families donated almost \$7500 in cash and gift cards. This is in addition to the 25 moving boxes full of gifts, 2 mattresses and bed frames and many, many gifts too big to fit into those boxes, such as bedding sets and other needed items. (Even our moving boxes are donated each year by Angie Davenport from A Mrakek Moving.)

And the gift wrapping brings out the best in our students. They are delighted to share in the joy of giving. We see bigger kids helping the younger ones to wrap a gift - showing patience and kindness. Our 7th and 8th graders helped to box up gifts and provided "heavy lifting" to load cars for delivery. They also assisted in cleaning up the gym and putting all of the tables away so that our maintenance staff would not need to follow behind us.

We know that we are making a difference not only in the families we are giving to, but especially in the hearts of our students. One of our 6th graders, Ben B., won a \$150 gift card from STL County for being vaccinated - and he donated it to our families in need along with a very nice note. I am so proud of all of our students!


