Intercede for us now with your Son Jesus.


Help our parish to be an instrument in the hands of God.



A NOTE FROM FR. MATTHEW PERUMPIL, MI

Dear Parish family,

Last Sunday we celebrated Mass with our Camillian Community and Fr. Jojo Orossa in his homily shared briefly about our founder St. Camillus. This weekend as the Church honors this great saint of charity I like to reflect on his life and example with you. Our Parish community is coming together to pray for the sick among us and celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing the Sick as a community. As the patron saint of the Sick and those who care of the sick I entrust all of us under the powerful intercession of St. Camillus.

St. Camillus de Lellis was born in Buccianico, Italy on May 25, 1550. His mother died when he was a child and he was neglected by his father. At the age 16, he joined his father in the Venetian army and spent a number of years serving in the military. He became an avid gambler and lived a carefree life until his conversion in 1575 at the age of 25. After his conversion he became a Capuchin novice but was unable to be professed because of an infected leg that would remain with him for life. After leaving the Capuchin novitiate, Camillus committed himself to serving the sick in the hospital and founded a group of pious men to serve the sick with the "love of a mother who would care for her only child who was seriously ill". This group was formally approved by the Church as a Religious Order (Camillians) with the mission of exclusively dedicating their lives in service to the sick even in danger to their lives. As you know I have been blessed to be a member of this wonderful religious family in the Church and now God has sent me to be with you to live out this mission in our parish community, especially to care for the sick and most vulnerable.



In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus's heart was moved with pity for the people for they were like sheep without a shepherd. I feel God is calling each one of us in our own ways to become "shepherds to one another". There are so many among us who are experiencing suffering of one kind or another. Let us reach out to them and become the shepherds, caring for and comforting them. Let us become the "good shepherd" like Jesus. Let us bring the Good News of the Lord to each of them with our kind words, support and prayers.

May St. Camillus inspire us to be channels of healing and intercede for all of us who are in need of healing. Let us pray especially for all those who are anointed with the Sacrament of the Sick this weekend.

First Saturday morning Mass 8:00 a.m. followed by confessions has returned to the 106th Street site.




ROSARY
