Intercede for us now with your Son Jesus.


Help our parish to be an instrument in the hands of God.

Unite and guide us as people of Faith, to become more like Jesus.



# **Epiphany**

# "Now the Work of Christmas Begins"

Christmas season this year is very short. Soon after we celebrated the Christmas day and the Feast of Holy Family on Sunday, this weekend we are celebrating the Feast of Epiphany. The intensity of these three great feasts helps us to focus beyond the festivity and ponder on the real meaning and significance of what we are celebrating. Epiphany does precisely that — leading us to live the meaning of Christmas through our daily lives, throughout the New Year.

Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem, He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. The Gospel tells of the faith of the Magi divinely guided; how this faith manifested itself in action by their seeking instruction from priests, by prostrating their very beings and offering their best treasures before the frail babe in Mary's arms: Gold in homage to his new kingship, symbol of their hearts offering love; Incense in homage to his divinity, symbol of their minds offering adoration; Myrrh in homage to His Humanity, symbol of their bodies offering to do penance.

Like the Magi, we too, are invited to bring Christ to others, revealing Him and his salvific mission. We become the Angels, the Shepherds and Magi of the Christmas story to make Christmas become alive in the lives of those who live in darkness and brokenness of every kind. Let us continue the real work of Christmas through our words and actions this New Year.

The feast of Epiphany brings the Christmas season to an end. To keep us in the right direction, here's a poem called "The Work of Christmas" composed by Howard Thurman, an African-American theologian, educator, and civil rights leader.

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins:

to find the lost,
to heal the broken,
to feed the hungry,
to release the prisoner,
to rebuild the nations,
to bring peace among the people,
to make music in the heart.

Blessings and Peace for a wonderful year 2022.

# 5 Ways to Mark Three Kings Day

- 1. Read the Gospel (Matthew 2:1-12) for the Epiphany of the Lord aloud with your family or class. Re-read it and allow the story to speak to you in some new way. Discuss the insights each person gained by reading it a second time.
- 2. People in Mexico, Spain, France, and Germany celebrate the day by sharing "King's Cake." Download a recipe from the Internet and bake it. Don't forget to place a symbol of the baby Jesus in the batter. This could be a small bean or an almond. The one who gets the slice of cake containing the symbol is considered to be especially blessed.



- 3. Gather with your family, neighbors, friends, or students, and take turns talking about the gifts you have each been given during this Christmas season. Move the conversation beyond that of material gifts in order to consider the ones that nurture heart and soul.
- 4. Work with someone at your parish to organize a visit with your family, friends, or students to a nursing home. Bring small gifts to share with the residents. Afterwards, consider the ways you could "step out" in order to share your gifts with others during the coming year.
- 5. Go from room to room in your home and consider the way each space is blessed. Resolve to make your dwelling a hospitable place in which to receive others. How can you make your home more gracious to friend and stranger alike?
