WHAT'S NEW WITH POPE FRANCIS?

- ◆ Pope Francis said that the poverty and exclusion from the job market caused by the coronavirus pandemic has made the work of Catholic groups that assist poor communities even more urgent than ever.
- ◆ Pope Francis expressed his sorrow at the death of Prince Philip in a letter to Queen Elizabeth II, his wife of 73 years.
- ◆ Pope Francis will now make his speeches to the public accessible in American Sign Language. The Vatican's communications announced the "no one left out" initiative at the end of last month.
- ◆ The Pope applauded the beautification of six Cistercian monks who were martyred in 1799 while trying to protect the Eucharist from desecration by French soldiers. Pope Francis asked the pilgrims gathered in St. Peter's Square on April 18 to applaud "the new Blessed."

ASK FR. CHRISTIAN

- Q. What is the significance of the purple stole that the priest wears when hearing Confessions?**
- A.** The priest wearing a stole is a sign of his clerical office. He should be wearing a stole when he celebrates any of the sacraments. At Mass, the colors vary according to the liturgical season – green, red, white or gold, and purple. Purple is used for the penitential seasons, Lent and Advent. Purple is also used for Confession, to represent penitence. A priest may hear a Confession without a purple stole in a time of emergency.

- Q. What color habits do Franciscan priests wear?**
- A.** St. Francis wore one that was made of bleached wool, which usually turned out gray, but had patches of different colors. The early Franciscans also wore the bleached wool, usually gray. Through the years, different branches of Franciscans continued to wear gray. However, in the last 200 years, for various historical reasons, Franciscans started to wear brown or black habits. At the present time, many of the Franciscans are returning to gray habits, although brown and black are still worn by many.
