## WISE WORDS FROM "HONEST ABE"

## THIS WEEK'S QUESTION

- Q. If we just follow our conscience, doesn't that pretty much guarantee that we will choose what is good and right?
- A. Conscience may be the single-most misunderstood issue among Catholics today! Our conscience: (1) reminds us always to do good and avoid evil; (2) makes a judgment about the good and evil of particular choices in a specific situation; and (3) bears witness after the fact to the good or evil that we have done (i.e., having a guilty conscience). Many people who reject Church teaching will say, "I'm just following my conscience." But what they mean is, they're looking to their conscience as the source of moral principles, which can be a serious error.

For instance many German Catholics followed their conscience when they supported Hitler. Another example was Al Capone, who was a Catholic, followed his conscience when he murdered so many, saying it was just business.

The conscience must be well-formed by educating and training it and studying the Scripture and following the guidelines of the Catholic Church. Practicing the virtues is another aspect of forming the conscience. So here's the answer to the question: If your conscience is well-formed, and you are being careful to reason clearly and objectively from true moral principles, then you must follow the reasoned judgment of your conscience about the morality of a specific act. Otherwise, seek reliable guidance and continue to form your conscience. Be cautious when you make choices.
