ASK FR. CHRISTIAN

- Q. The Gospels sometime speak of Jesus having brothers or sisters. Yet we have always been taught that Mary was a virgin throughout her life. So what's the real answer?
- A. Basically, for Catholics and Orthodox Christians and present-day Protestants, we believe Jesus was born of a virgin, and Mary would remain a virgin for the rest of her life. Why? Because in the early readings of the Church, after the Bible was written, that is what was believed. Secondly, it was a custom to call cousins 'brothers and sisters.' So those mentioned may very well have been Jesus' cousins. And also, some people believe that there's a possibility that Joseph was married to another woman before Mary, that his wife died but left other children, who would be Jesus' step-brothers and sisters. If you go back to the very ancient Church, before the Bible was completed, Mary was considered a virgin all her life, all the way up to recent times. It was not questioned until about 1500 years later.

HONOR THY CHILDREN

In order to prevent child sexual abuse, we need to understand what it is. Child abuse, including child sexual abuse, has occurred throughout our society for centuries. After several recent years of decline, child abuse appears to be on the rise again. It is widespread and cuts across all cultures, religions, and socioeconomic groups. It is estimated that one in four girls and one in six boys are sexually abused by the time they are 18 years old. Only about 10% of children ever reveal what happened, out of shame.

Simply stated, child sexual abuse is defined as any adult interaction with a child for the purpose of meeting the sexual needs of the adult. Sexual abuse can be physical, verbal, auditory, or visual and, therefore, does not necessarily require physical contact between the abuser and the child. For example, watching a child undress, take a shower, or go to the bathroom for sexual arousal would be child sexual abuse. Other non-physical behaviors include an adult exposing his or her sexual organs to a child or speaking about things of a sexual nature that are inappropriate to a child.
