ASK FR. CHRISTIAN

Q. What is the difference between Anointing of the Sick and Last Rites?

A. Basically, they are the same sacrament, one praying for a person's recovery, the other for the journey from this life to the next. The prayers are a little different.

Anointing of the Sick is not just for the dying. A sick person may be anointed before surgery, whether or not a serious illness is the reason for the surgery. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient reason to be strengthened by this sacrament. This sacrament is administered to bring physical strength during an illness. It is good to administer this sacrament with family/people gathered around.

Last Rites often happens in conjunction with or following the administration of the Anointing of the Sick. Last Rites are given when death is near. Holy Communion may be given if the person is able to receive it. Last Rites may also be accompanied by an apostolic blessing that gives a plenary indulgence to the dying person. "Through the holy mysteries of our redemption, may Almighty God release you from all punishments in this life and the life to come. May He open you to the gates of paradise and welcome you to everlasting joy."
