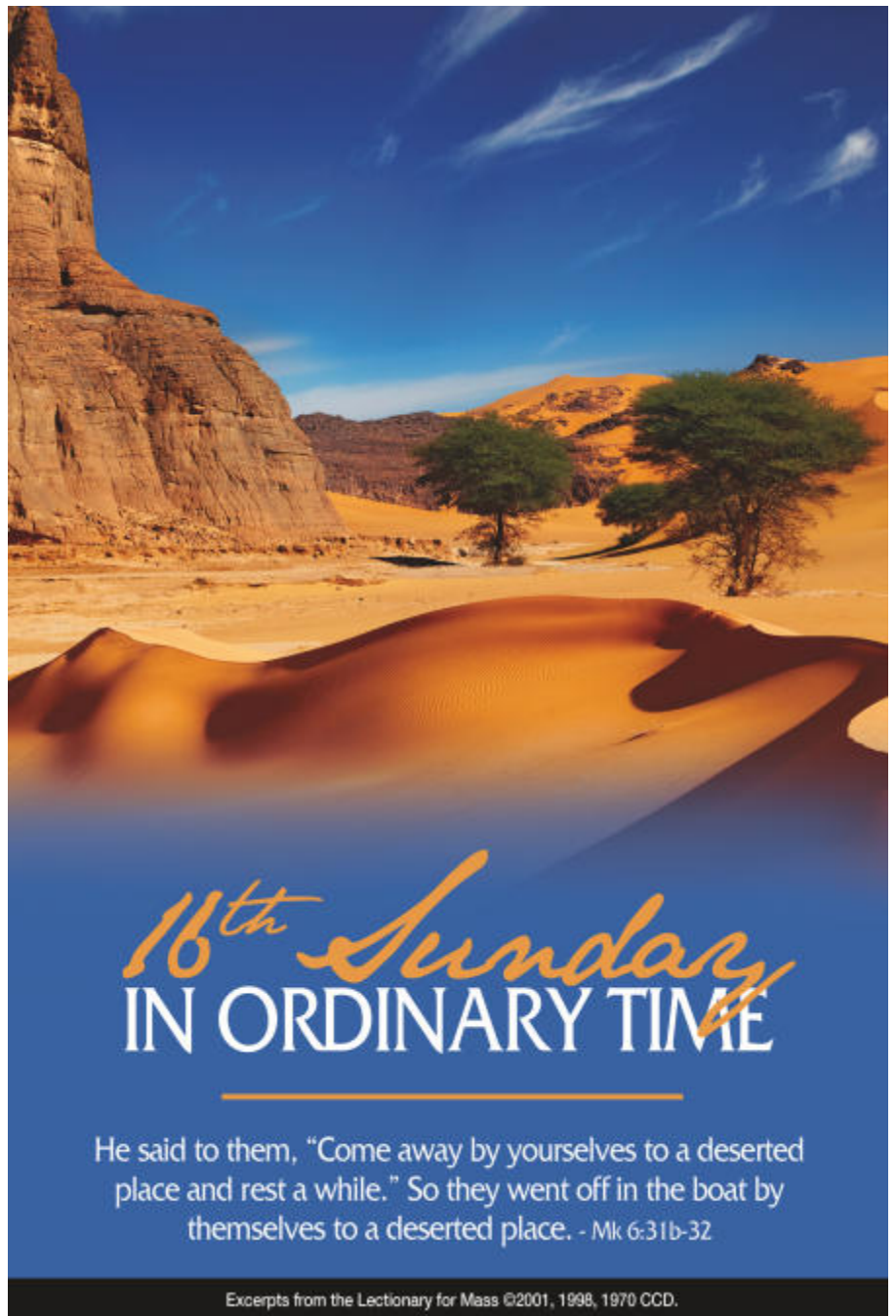

THIS WEEK'S QUESTION

- Q. Why do we make small crosses on our forehead, lips, and heart before the Gospel is read?
- A. During Mass, we make a little cross on our head, lips, and heart because these outward gestures made with our bodies are pointing to an inward prayer that is happening in our hearts. When the Gospel is about to be read, the priest says, “A Reading from the Gospel according to St. So-and-So.” The congregation then responds verbally and makes the three little crosses. Remember, the cross is a sign of redemption in and through Jesus Christ. This is an outward act to profess our inward faith in the Trinity.

We cross our forehead so that the Word of God may be in our thoughts and purify our minds. We cross our lips so that our speech may be holy and incline us to share the Gospel with others. And we cross our hearts to invite God to strengthen our love for Him and others. All of this is so that we might know, proclaim, and love Jesus Christ all the more.

So next time you're at Mass and the Gospel is about to be proclaimed, pray that these three little crosses lead us to a deeper communion with Jesus.

RESPECT FOR LIFE

For many years, the most significant argument has been that the so-called fetus is not a human life. They also claim that the question of when human life begins is uncertain and is a religious issue. However, medical textbooks and scientific reference works consistently agree that life begins at conception, when a genetically distinct individual is brought into existence. Some of the world's most prominent scientists and physicians testified to a U.S. Senate committee that human life begins at conception. At these same hearings, pro-abortionists, invited to do so, failed to produce even a single expert witness who would testify that life begins at any point other than conception.

From the moment of conception, the unborn fetus is not simple, but very complex. The newly fertilized egg contains a staggering amount of genetic information, sufficient to control the individual's growth and development for an entire lifetime. It is scientifically inaccurate and untrue to say a fetus is not a human being simply because he or she is at an earlier stage of development than an infant. The child has its own DNA, fingerprints, and blood type, distinct from the mother's.
