THIS WEEK’S QUESTION

Q. Do unborn babies go to heaven?

A. This question has no firm answer within the Catholic Church. God’s mercy is beyond our comprehension, so we should be at peace knowing that God is the one who meets these precious children as they depart this life even prior to having been born. Here are various options to consider, which may or may not be what happens to these miscarried, aborted, or stillborn babies:

1. Though our Church teaches that Baptism is necessary for salvation, God can offer the grace of Baptism outside the act of physical baptism. Thus, we should not worry about the fact that these children die without the external act of Baptism.
2. Some suggest that God knows who among the lost babies would have chosen Him or not. Though they never lived their lives in this world, God’s knows how these children would have lived, had they been given the opportunity. If that is true, then they will be judged in accord with God’s perfect knowledge of their free will.
3. Some people think that God offers these babies salvation in a similar way He offered it to the angels. They are given the opportunity to make a choice when they come into the presence of God, and that choice becomes their eternal choice.

We believe with certainty that God loves these precious children, and they will be treated with His mercy and justice.

RESPECT FOR LIFE
