## THIS WEEK'S QUESTION

- Q. Are Catholic colleges and universities still tied to the Catholic Church?
- A. Under American law, many of the most famous “Catholic” universities in this country have no legal connection with the Church. Changes began about 60 years ago, when one college after another legally transferred ownership, with what was seen as good intentions, from the founding religious community to a non-denominational primarily lay organization. In more recent years, the bishops of the U.S. formally voted to tell Catholic colleges and universities not to confer honors upon public figures who expressly support abortion on demand. However, the schools can do what they wish, and the Church can only protest, with no authority whatsoever.

None of this discounts the good occurring again and again at these universities. So many officials and professors are committed Christians. A Catholic atmosphere prevails, and Christ is the standard. Chapels dot the campuses, and students fill the pews every day wanting to be good lawyers or accountants and, above all, genuine disciples. All exceptions admitted, alternative institutions offer nothing better.

## RESPECT FOR LIFE

On November 5, 2003, President Bush signed into law a ban on partial-birth abortions. He is to be praised and commended for his action. This is a big step in the right direction and the first time our government finally came to the defense of the innocent babies in the womb.

If abortion had not been legalized 47 years ago, 62 million babies' lives would not have been snuffed out. These babies would be in the work force paying billions of dollars into Social Security, and the economy would be elevated by possibly trillions of dollars. Or maybe one of these aborted babies would have found a cure for cancer! There is no end to the possibilities of what could have been accomplished by these babies as adults.
