

THIS WEEK'S QUESTION

Q. Why can't priests get married?

- A.** Some Catholic priests can get married and some can't. This distinction is possible because there is nothing in the deposit of faith that prohibits priests from being married. There is a long-standing practice, though, to require celibacy of Latin (or Roman) rite priests. In the Eastern rites, celibacy generally is not required, although it is forbidden for bishops. Additionally, former Protestant ministers who have been ordained as priests can remain married, under provisions approved by St. John Paul.

The majority of Roman-rite Catholic priests are celibate, and the Latin Church does not see this as an imposition. Rather, it sees celibacy as a sign that the priest's consecration to the Lord is with an undivided heart, where "they give themselves entirely to God and to men." Celibacy is a sign of this new life to the service of which the Church's minister is consecrated; accepted with a joyous heart, celibacy radiantly proclaims the reign of God.

RESPECT FOR LIFE

Prior to the legalization of abortion, advocates for abortion held out the panacea of the elimination of "unwanted children" if only abortion were legalized. Despite the fact that some 60 million "unwanted babies" have died in the intervening period, the pro-choice lobby still uses this argument to justify abortion.

In the 1960s & '70s, the pro-choice position was that legalizing abortion would drastically reduce child abuse. America legalized abortion ... and child abuse has skyrocketed!

We all agree that every child should be wanted. This is an idealistic goal, but sadly we do not live in an idyllic world. How can anyone possibly insist that the value of an unborn baby is to be determined by whether a mother wants him or her at any given time? To use being wanted by someone as a measure of whether a human life is allowed to live is a truly frightening concept!
