

#### THIS WEEK'S QUESTION

- Q. I've heard that the Catholic Church is the wealthiest "business" in the world. Is that true?
- A. The Catholic Church has a net worth of approximately \$1.5 trillion, which is about 183% more than their worth 25 years ago. They have found many ways to make money because of their land holdings and bank accounts. The Church makes money through donations, the sale of religious items, and leasing space to shops and restaurants. The Church is the largest non-government provider of education and healthcare in the world. Additionally, the Vatican's art collection is worth billions, that includes paintings, sculptures, gems, drawings, and other forms of art, which cannot be sold. So who owns the Vatican? Vatican City and its property and assets belong to the Holy See (also called the See of Rome), which itself belongs to God.


