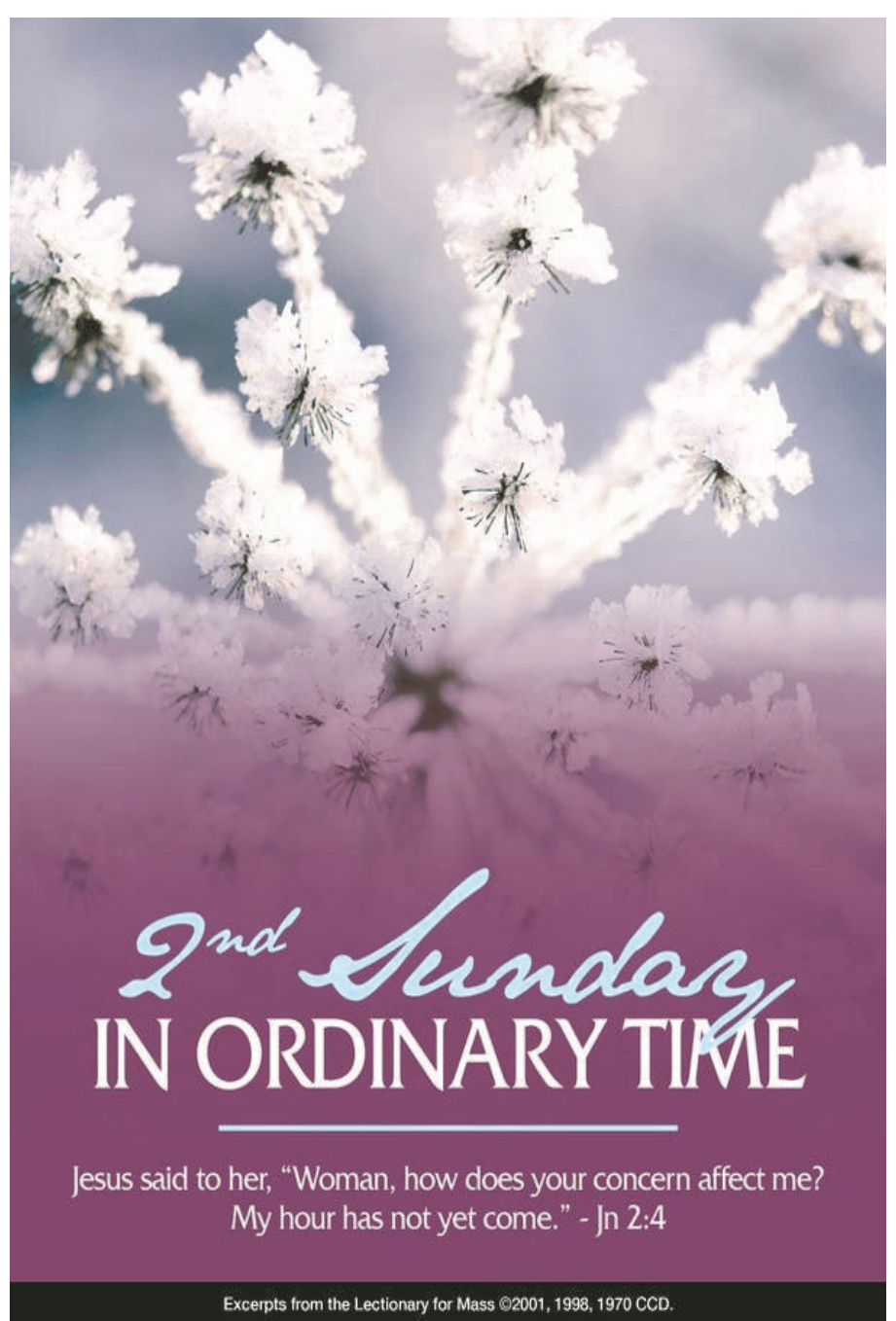

Here's a timeline of a baby's life from conception to three months:

- ⇒ 18 days: a baby's heart begins to beat
- ⇒ 43 days: brain coordinates movement
- ⇒ 7 weeks: a baby can hiccup
- ⇒ 8 weeks: organs can function
- ⇒ 9 weeks: has permanent, individual fingerprints
- ⇒ 10 weeks: can feel pain
- ⇒ 12 weeks: baby can smile, suck his thumb, and make a fist

THIS WEEK'S QUESTION

- Q. Growing up through Catholic schools, we were always taught that suicide was a mortal sin. That never did make sense to me. If someone is that sick, certainly God should understand. Is that still the Church's teaching?
- A. This is a difficult topic, and suicide is always the wrong choice. But in order to assign personal guilt, we would need to know all the inner workings of the person's mind, and only God has access to one's conscience. Certainly, factors such as depression, extreme emotional distress, mental illness, and severe anxiety may have clouded the person's mind and would play a factor in God's consideration, so they may not be fully responsible for their action. This doesn't make the action good, or even neutral, but the Church does teach that these factors would have diminished their personal guilt.

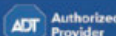
