

MAKING CHOICES

Choice. Abortion advocates do not want to talk about facts or science, but they love to talk about "choice." They refuse to be called "pro-abortion," but they gladly accept the label "pro-choice."

Indeed, nothing has so clouded and confused the politics of the abortion debate more than the misconstrued application of this word. For years, abortion advocates have sought to bestow upon "choice" a nobility of its own, thereby avoiding discussion of what is being chosen.

A choice must relate to the context where it is applied. Laws against rape, murder, assault, theft, and drunk driving are all "anti-choice." A choice cannot be given, in order to protect a more fundamental freedom. We are only free to choose as long as that choice does not harm another person. Abortion does. It kills babies.


