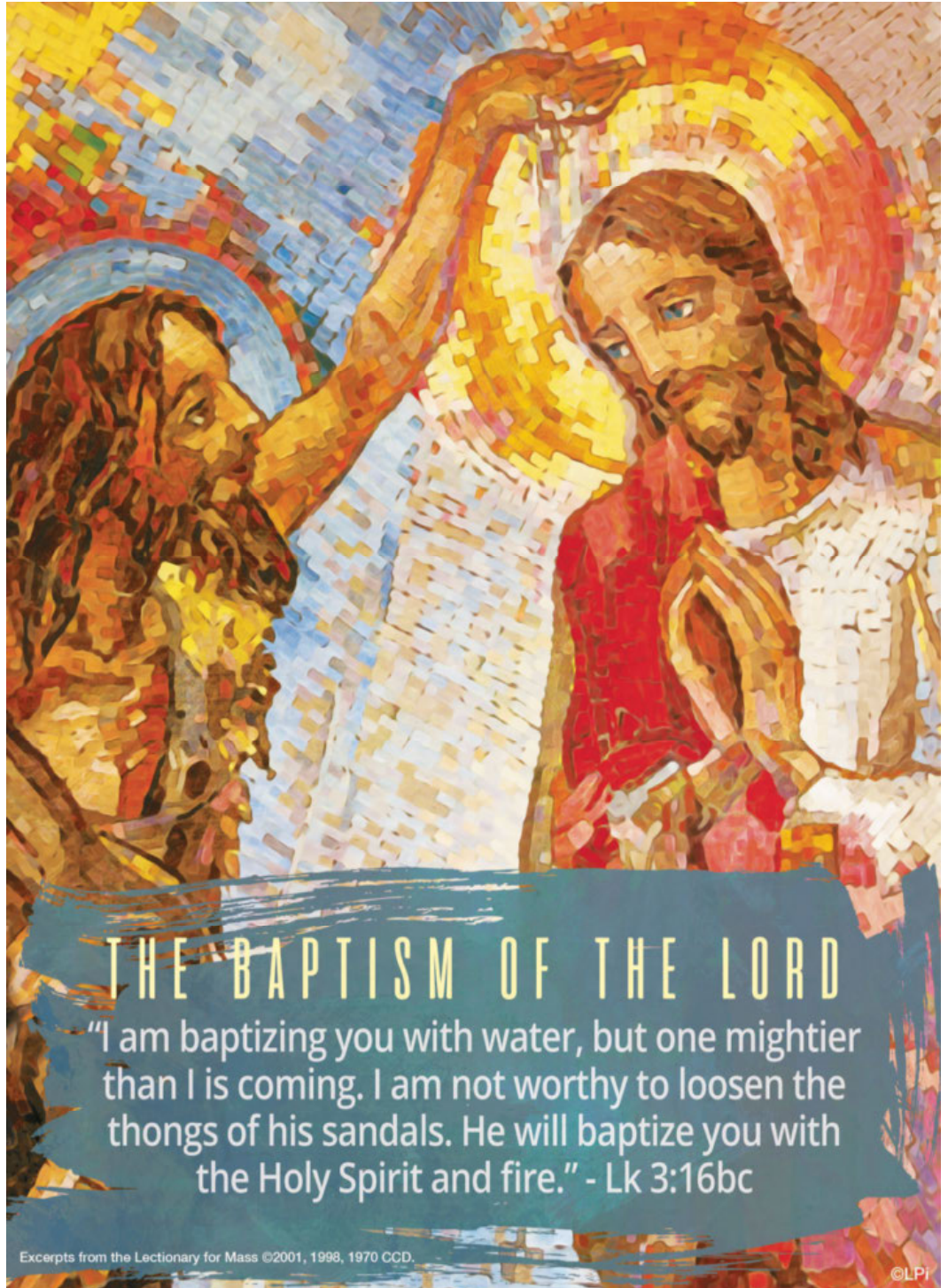

Pastoral Message

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we celebrate the baptism of the Lord. This will officially mark the end the Christmas season. Even though it is the end of one season, it marks the beginning of Ordinary Time. Remember that Ordinary Time does not mean 'ordinary' in the usually sense of the word. Ordinary refers to 'counted' time or ordered time. The Baptism of the Lord is the perfect feast for the transition between Christmas and Ordinary Time because it moves us from the excitement of a new beginning and hope in the birth of Christ to the every day or ordinary work of growing in Christ. The whole Christian life finds its source in its beginning, that is, in the sacrament of Baptism. If baptism is the source of Christian life, what is the source of the sacrament of Baptism?

Paragraph 1235 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church says:

“In his Passover Christ opened to all men the fountain of Baptism. He had already spoken of his Passion, which he was about to suffer in Jerusalem, as a "Baptism" with which he had to be baptized. The blood and water that flowed from the pierced side of the crucified Jesus are types of Baptism and the Eucharist, the sacraments of new life. From then on, it is possible "to be born of water and the Spirit" in order to enter the Kingdom of God.”

“See where you are baptized, see where Baptism comes from, if not from the cross of Christ, from his death. There is the whole mystery: he died for you. In him you are redeemed, in him you are saved.” - St. Ambrose of Milan.

It is appropriate then, that we have this time for growing in the grace of Christmas. We move toward Lent in just a few short weeks. Lent is a time for entering more deeply into the Passion and death of Christ so we can plunge deeper into the depths of our baptism. New life then comes at the end when we culminate our immersion into the death of Christ by our celebration of Easter. There is a great and beautiful rhythm of the liturgical season in the Church. The more we live it, the more we imitate the process of the divine life of Christ and the more we grow into the divine life into which we have had the privilege to receive.



Liturgical Tidbits...

The Sign of the Cross

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. It is a simple phrase that we are used to saying every time we begin prayer. It is the same when we start the greatest prayer of the Church which is the Mass. But what does this simple prayer mean? In order to know what it really means we need to focus on the word “In.” There are different ways to understand this word. For example, when an ambassador visits another country, he or she comes “in” the name of another country. The ambassador represents that country. However, when we as Catholics say “in” as we begin prayer, we mean something very different. This simple Trinitarian formula should remind us of our baptism. The word “baptism” in Greek means to plunge into something. In baptism we are plunged into the life of God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. At the beginning of Mass, when we say, “In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, it really reminds us that we have been, are now and will be forever, immersed in the Triune God.

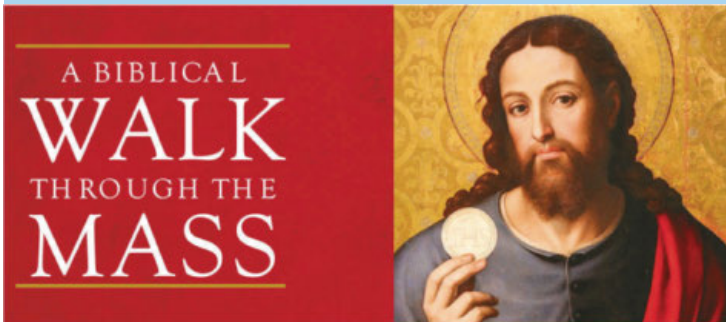

How to Go to Confession

Reconciliation may be face to face or anonymous, with a screen between you and the priest. Choose the option that is the most comfortable for you.

1. The priest gives you a blessing or greeting. He may share a brief Scripture passage.
2. Make the Sign of the Cross and say: "Bless me father, for I have sinned. My last confession was (give the number of weeks, months or years).
3. Confess all of your sins to the priest. The priest will help you to make a good confession. If you are unsure about how to confess or you feel uneasy, just ask him to help you. Answer his questions without hiding anything out of fear or shame. Place your trust in God, a merciful Father who wants to forgive you.
4. Following your confession of sins, say, "I am sorry for these and all of my sins."
5. The priest assigns you a penance and offers advice to help you be a better Catholic.
6. Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins

Act of Contrition

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.
