



These sessions will once again be held on the second Thursday of the month at 6:00 PM in the Seton Room.




When it comes to creating a hymn, it goes without saying that the author and composer have a close relationship. That the author writes the text (a lot of times it is a poem), the composer composes a tune to go with it, and then a hymn is born. This isn't always the case, though. Many hymns worked the other way around, with authors writing lines to existing tunes. Hundreds of hymns, songs, chants, and even classical masterpieces, are sung to borrowed tunes. In my opinion, the three most popular classical masterpiece that are used for the melody of a hymn are "Joyful Joyful" (Beethoven's 9th Symphony), "Joy to the World" (Handel's Messiah), and O God beyond All Praising. (Gustov Holst's "The Planets") Holst wrote 7 movements each titled after a planet (did not use Earth and

Pluto) and O God beyond All Praising is from the melody of "Jupiter". You will hear "Joy to the World" a lot this Christmas season (even though the author/composer wrote this song to be sung year round) and O God beyond All Praising around the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God and Epiphany. 2021 was a tough year for many and we look forward to 2022 – with these words from O God beyond All Praising:

"And whether our tomorrows be filled with good or ill, we'll triumph through our sorrows and rise to bless you still..."





SAINT OF THE WEEK

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint." COMPLETE AUTO BODY REPAIR QUALITY WORK




