

Angels of Hope



Discipleship

In the tenth chapter (vs. 36) of Mark's gospel he shows what it means to be a genuine disciple by contrasting the condition and response of the blind beggar Bartimaeus with the request and the response of the disciples. The disciples, James and John, ask Jesus for a favor; Jesus

asks them "what can I do for you?" and them they rather arrogantly respond that what they want are seats of power. The remaining disciples get rather upset when they hear of this (most likely because they didn't think of it first) and Jesus has to sit them down and explain what it means if they are to follow him. We must also place this encounter with His disciples in the bigger picture of His preparing to enter Jerusalem right before His passion. They ought to be the ones who "get it" but it appears that at every turn they are missing the point of what he has been trying to teach them. We see the results of this lack of understanding as the disciples run away when things get too "hot" for them to handle in the garden at His arrest. The disciples eventually catch on but it takes them a while.

Bartimaeus, on the other hand, is a prime example of how a true disciple ought to respond when one encounters Jesus. In the same chapter, Bartimaeus is bold when he becomes aware that Jesus is near even though the crowd tells him to keep still. In fact their

comments make him all the bolder in crying out to get Jesus' attention. His approach to Jesus is not one of arrogance but of respect and it says that he threw off his cloak (shedding all worldly possessions, holding nothing back) and came up to Him. Jesus asks him the same question as He did of the disciples (vs. 51) but his response is different, Bartimaeus simply says, "let me see again." This is a very different approach from the disciples and in the gospel of Mark; probably the only true prayer a Christian should ever make. Jesus was all about seeing; seeing the poor, seeing the kingdom, seeing the presence of God making a difference all around oneself and responding. This kind of sight, however, demanded change in the lives of the disciples and in the lives of all those who wanted to follow Him. This is why Jesus demanded repentance. It is also significant that Jesus doesn't say to Bartimaeus, "receive your sight", as he did with others but simply states "go your way; your faith has saved you." In a very real way telling Bartimaeus that his faith already allows him to see what He needs to see. When one truly sees then you follow where the master leads, even to the cross. In the gospel of Mark, a blind man shows us how to pray and what to pray for if it is to be genuine. Sometimes we just have to open our eyes and see what is right before us!

Annual Report Part 1: As I begin, I wanted to take a moment to thank all the parents and parishioners for their support. Whether your support comes in form of prayers, monetarily, or donations of supplies or your time as a volunteer, we greatly appreciate all you do to support our amazing students and teachers. Your continued support is invaluable to us.

On Wednesday, October 13th, at our School Committee meeting, the committee reviewed and approved the Annual Report for Holy Angels School for the 2020-2021 school year. Below, I share the day-to-day school operations for 2020-2021. Next week, in Part 2, I will share curriculum.

As part of the parish community and relying on the grace of God, Holy Angels School shares in the ministry of teaching the Catholic faith which is practiced daily by forming community, proclaiming the Gospel, serving others, and praising God.

With the support of parents and guided by the Holy Spirit, the faculty and staff are dedicated to helping students to grow and mature in faith, knowledge and values by providing a quality curriculum with high academic and behavioral standards. Students and staff gather for Monday Assembly to reflect on the Gospel focus of the week, they come together each week as a faith community to celebrate the Eucharist, and daily prayer is part of the regular experience for all as praise and thanksgiving is offered at the start and end of the school day.

Holy Angels' School continues to be viewed as one of the top schools in the archdiocese, maintaining its' full accreditation and having received Exemplary Recognition in the area of Student Services during past accreditation reviews.

Holy Angels School, along with every other school in the country, was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. I promised parents that students would be in-person for the entirety of the school year. With the support of the teachers and the Maintenance staff we succeeded! Students and teachers wore masks, followed strict sanitation protocols, and maintained the procedures throughout the year. Parents partnered with the school and kept their children home when they were not feeling well. The Community working together for the greater good of the school made for a successful year.

<u>Music Classroom Needs:</u> Mrs. Scheit does an amazing job teaching music to the students. Not only does she teach music, she plays piano for Thursday Mass, runs the school choir, prepares the students for the Christmas and Spring concerts, and leads the Forensic team.

The music program at Holy Angels has been blessed with being able to have a variety of instruments to use in the classroom. This is so important because it gives students the opportunity to engage in music using different mediums while fostering different interests and talents along the way. We have been so lucky to have a collection of guitars to use for instruction. However in recent years the guitars have begun to show signs of their age and many are not usable anymore. With larger class sizes, Mrs. Scheit is in need of some new instruments in order to provide each student with their own. She could really use about 8 new guitars and cases. EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Family Connection: Today's Gospel offers us a powerful example of faith and persistence in prayer. Those around him rebuked Bartimaeus for his efforts to attract Jesus' attention. When silenced by the crowd, however, Bartimaeus called out all the more. He is persistent and bold in his confidence that Jesus will show mercy on him and do what he asks. His persistence and great confidence that Jesus would help him reminds us of the confidence with which our children bring to us their needs. In their faith and trust we can find an example of the attitude with which we might approach God in prayer.

As a family, recall a request that has been made repeatedly by one family member to another. Talk about why the request continues to be made if the answer continues to be no. Then read together today's Gospel, Mark 10:46-52. After reading the Gospel, pose questions such as these to your family: Why must Bartimaeus be persistent in calling out to Jesus? (Some people in the crowd are telling him to be quiet.) What does Bartimaeus do when some try to stop him? (He calls out to Jesus all the more.) When Jesus stops and calls for him. what does Jesus do and say? (He restores Bartimaeus's sight; Jesus tells Bartimaeus his faith has saved him.) When we pray, God wants us to be so confident he will help us that we don't permit anyone to keep us from bringing our needs to God in prayer. Invite family members to identify the things they need most from God. Pray these prayers of petition together as a family, confident that God will hear and answer your prayers. Respond to each petition, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on us." Conclude by praying the Glory Be to the Father. Taken from Loyola Press Sunday Connection; loyolapress.com


