

Angels of Hope



Once You Know (Epiphany of the Lord)

The magi had "dissed" the King, you do not "dis" the King and plan on living very long to tell about it. He told them to return and tell him what they had discovered about this "new born king" but now they knew something they had not known before and once you know...!

The story of the magi in many respects reflects aspects of our own story. We search and search for something, finally see it and because it demands something (often times a lot) we turn around and pretend nothing was there or at the very least it wasn't what we actually saw or wanted. The problem with this scenario is that once you know, though you may deny it, it will gnaw at you until you respond.

Epiphanies of any kind bring clarity to our lives whether in the secular realm or the sacred and usually demand a response. Throughout human history this has been the case: Moses and the burning bush, Abraham with his son Isaac, Mary and the angel, the disciples on Mount Tabor, Francis of Assisi, Martin Luther King Jr., and Mother Teresa of Calcutta all had epiphanies in their lives and until they responded they could not rest. They saw the world and their lives in that world differently and it demanded that they change. It was not that they were bad people before the epiphany, in fact they were good people, it was just that who they were and the way they lived was no longer an adequate response to what they had come to realize. Something "more" was being demanded of them and they had to make an important decision of whether or not they

would respond to the "divine invitation" knowing it would probably take them down a difficult path. The identity of the "child" was revealed to the magi as was the intent of the king; the question was what were they going to do with the information and how would they respond? One response would have likely resulted in the life of the child being ended; another response could have possibly ended their own lives. Though we don't know the fate of the magi we do know at least one decision they didn't make.

The feast of the "Epiphany of the Lord" celebrates the fact that the child Jesus was revealed as the savior of the world and hopefully the way we live our lives, on a daily basis, is a response to this knowledge. Though there are plenty of folks in the world who don't know Jesus too often, if we are honest, we recognize we are living as if we don't know him either and then we wonder why we are restless or not at peace; it's because we know! St. Augustine speaks of this: "we are restless until we rest in you." The only way we will know the peace we seek is to respond to what has been revealed to us and embrace it that it might fill us.

God has not stopped sending epiphanies to people of faith, thank God for that, I believe what has happened is that we live in a world where we are easily distracted and often don't want to be inconvenienced. Epiphanies bring clarity and that clarity demands change and action, we may ignore and\or deny what we have come to know for a long time but we will not rest until we respond; because once you know...! So it was for the magi, so it is for us.

EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Family Connection: The tradition of giving gifts at Christmas is thought by some to be rooted in the gift giving of the Magi. In many cultures, gifts are not exchanged at Christmas, but rather on the feast of the Epiphany. Whenever you exchange your Christmas gifts, take some time to reflect on this tradition of gift giving at Christmas. Think of the best gift you have received. What was it? What made it special? Was it the gift itself, the thought that went into it, or the person who gave it to you?

Read today's Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12. The gifts of the Magi—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. They are special because in giving them, the Magi acknowledge who Jesus was to be: our Savior. We pray that we will acknowledge Jesus as Savior in all that we do and say. Conclude by singing together "We Three Kings."




