

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

The Church, I believe in her wisdom, provides a variety of feasts throughout the liturgical year that offer us opportunities to recall important aspects of our faith and encourages us to reflect on what part it may or may not continue to play in our lives. In

the year of 2013, Pope Benedict IVX declared "The Year of Faith" and it was a prime opportunity to take more seriously the feasts we celebrated that year, opening ourselves to being challenged in the ways, we live our faith on a day-to-day basis.

It doesn't get more basic than baptism. For the Lord it was the starting point for His public ministry and for us it is the starting point for everything we do when it comes to our faith. All of our sacraments, ministries, life commitments, works promoting peace and justice and so much more are all rooted in our baptism. Whether we were baptized as an infant or as an adult it starts with "putting on Christ" through the waters of baptism; ultimately committing ourselves to being a disciple of Jesus, who is Lord and Savior, promising to do what it takes to be faithful to the gospel message. This begs the question: is that happening in the way we live? (Not always an easy question to answer.)

The Gospel of Luke works very hard to present Jesus as a person of prayer. Jesus ultimately ends his ministry in prayer and today's gospel show Jesus beginning his ministry with prayer; once baptized Jesus turns back to prayer, not a coincidence. The gospel doesn't tell us how he prayed or the types of prayers he used, probably not important to the gospel writer. What was important was the fact that Jesus rooted himself in the presence of God and as a consequence heard the voice of God speak to him clearly, "You are my beloved Son." (Lk3:22) The example of Jesus shows us what we need to do if our baptism is to make a difference in the way we live, we must pray. It is not surprising to me, when folks tell me God seems far away or their faith is waning, that they do not pray as much or that they do not pray at all. There is nothing magic about baptism; it has to be rooted in our daily lives.

Folks, as we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, let us recall that through our own baptism we are called to learn to pray as Jesus did so that we can hear the voice of God that occurs deep within us. In this way, we will keep God near to us and grow in faithful discipleship.

I pray 2021 brought you blessings. If sorrow or challenges came, I pray that you felt God's loving care around you. Every day that I go to our sites I see and feel all of this: the blessings, the sorrows, and the challenges. What keeps me going is the last but the greatest of these: God's loving care in the people I meet. That care is experienced no less through your gift, which keeps our sites going, and which circulates God's love (there must be a better verb!).

The ways we have to embrace the season of giving change over time. As children we can hardly sleep, what with the excitement that comes with the arrival of Santa; entering our independence, we take time and efort to fnd and share something memorable with the special people in our lives; and as the years pass, it's time that becomes most valuable - the chance to break routines and share relaxing visits with the people who have been with us on the journey.

This has been my experience, and I hope some version of it has been yours, too. For our brothers and sisters afflicted with poverty, these stages are likely no less precious, but are perhaps rarer. Imagine how hard it can be to create and sustain traditions, or to do something special at Thanksgiving and Christmas, when there's so much instability: the struggle to remain housed, to look after children, to provide regular healthy meals – in the face of these necessities, celebrating becomes in itself another life challenge. That's why the House of Peace launched its Holiday Food Box and Toy drives, and why we sign up hundreds and hundreds of households each year, and share with these homes, individuals and families what we have collected from our caring community. This is the "why," and your support is the "how.

For the 2021 fiscal year, the Holy Angels Conference of Saint Vincent de Paul provided \$87,471 in assistance and \$11,898 of 'In Kind' value goods made up of furniture (\$2,771), clothing (\$7,546) and other items (\$1,581). We served our community through 431 visits. These were not in-person home visits, but those done through telephone and mail due to the pandemic. We helped a total of 803 men, women and children.

We look forward to serving the community in 2022 and are appreciative of the area parishes that support our efforts. Saint Vincent de Paul provides a wonderful opportunity for those moved by the Holy Spirit to serve the poor in our community. EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Family Connection: Every family has a unique identity that is defined by the behaviors, attitudes, and expectations that govern a family's daily life. This identity is influenced by the family history of the parents, but each family's expression of this history is unique. In today's Gospel, we learn that Jesus' behavior, attitudes, and expectations were governed by his identity as God's beloved Son. In our Baptism, we were made children of this same heavenly Father. This identity as members of the family of God, and as brothers and sisters of Jesus, also shapes our family's daily life.

What are some of the things that make our family life unique? Celebrate these things about your family life. Read today's Gospel, Luke 3:15-16,21-22. Observe that Jesus' identity as the Beloved Son of the Father governed his behaviors, attitudes, and expectations. Recall that at our Baptism we were made children of this same heavenly Father. How does this identity as a member of the family of God govern and shape our family life? Conclude in prayer together that we will remain faithful to our baptismal identity as children of God and as brothers or sisters of Jesus. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer.


